ACTION

Adopt Resolution No. 12611 authorizing:

- 1) Acceptance of Proposition 202 grant funds from Gila River Indian Community in the amount of \$90,128.
- 2) The Assistant City Manager or designee(s), to execute any necessary documents and/or agreements to facilitate the receipt or transmittal of the above specified grant funds in the amount of \$90,128.
- 3) A budget transfer in the amount of \$45,000 from the adopted FY 2022/23 Future Grants and/or Grant Contingency budget to newly created cost centers to record the grant activity. (\$45,128 was anticipated and included in the City Manager Division's FY2022/23 budget.)

BACKGROUND

In the 2002 State General Election, Arizona voters enacted Proposition 202, the 17-Tribe Indian Self-Reliance Initiative. Under tribal-state gaming compacts, Arizona tribes share a percentage of their annual gaming revenues with local school districts, state and local governments and other public entities to provide services that benefit the general public. In addition to directly receiving funds, the City is asked to pass through gaming funds to local entities and organizations.

The Gila River Indian Community periodically solicits proposals from eligible local governments and community non-profit organizations. Awards are based on their evaluation of the submitted proposals.

For FY2022/23, the Gila River Indian Community has approved grants to the City for the following purposes:

The total FY2022/23 gaming grant distribution will be \$90,128.

Related Policies; References

On June 21, 2022, the Scottsdale City Council adopted Resolution No. 12474 authorizing the Government Relations Director or designee to submit Proposition 202 grant applications to various local Indian Nations during the period of July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2023.

ANALYSIS & ASSESSMENT

Community Involvement

The provisions of the Indian Gaming Compacts developed pursuant to Proposition 202 provide for an annual distribution of a portion of gaming revenues to local governments. Cooperative efforts between the City of Scottsdale and the Gila River Indian Community to distribute these funds results in benefits to Scottsdale area residents.

RESOURCE IMPACTS

Available Funding

Funds in the amount of \$90,128 will be received from the Gila River Indian Community. A budget transfer in the amount of \$45,000 is requested from the adopted FY 2022/23 Grant Contingency and/or the Future Grants budget to newly created cost centers to record grant activity. (\$45,128 was anticipated and included in the City Manager Division’s FY2022/23 budget.)

Staffing, Workload Impact

Impact to staffing and existing workload will be minimal.

OPTIONS & STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Recommended Approach

Adopt Resolution No. 12611 authorizing:

- 1) Acceptance of Proposition 202 grant funds from Gila River Indian Community in the amount of \$90,128.

- 3) A budget transfer in the amount of \$45,000 from the adopted FY 2022/23 Future Grants and/or Grant Contingency budget to newly created cost centers to record the grant activity. (\$45,128 was anticipated and included in the City Manager Division’s FY2022/23 budget.)





RESOLUTION NO. 12611

A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SCOTTSDALE, MARICOPA COUNTY, ARIZONA, AUTHORIZING THE CITY TO ACCEPT FUNDS FROM THE GILA RIVER INDIAN COMMUNITY, PURSUANT TO REVENUE SHARING PROVISIONS OF STATE LAW RELATING TO INDIAN GAMING, TO FUND SERVICES AND PROGRAMS BENEFITTING THE GENERAL PUBLIC.

WHEREAS, at the November 5, 2002, general election, Arizona voters approved Proposition 202, the "Indian Gaming Preservation and Self-Reliance Act" ("Proposition 202"), establishing conditions pursuant to which the governor would enter into a new standard form of tribal-state gaming compact; and

WHEREAS, one legal requirement of Proposition 202 requires that tribes distribute a percentage of their annual gaming revenues to cities, towns and counties of the tribe's choosing, to be used for government services that benefit the general public, including public safety, mitigation of impacts of gaming, and promotion of commerce and economic development; and

WHEREAS, the City of Scottsdale has requested that the Gila River Indian Community, a federally recognized Indian tribe, convey to the City a portion of its annual local revenue-sharing contribution required to be paid to local governments for the benefit of the general public, pursuant to A.R.S. Section 5-601.02, and the Gila River Indian Community has agreed to do so,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Scottsdale, as follows:

Section 1. The City Council hereby authorizes the acceptance of Proposition 202 grant funds from the Gila River Indian Community in the amount of \$90,128.

Section 2. The City Council hereby authorizes the Assistant City Manager or designee(s), to execute any necessary documents and/or agreements to facilitate the receipt or transmittal of the above specified grant funds in the amount of \$90,128.

Section 3. The City Council hereby authorizes a budget transfer in the amount of \$45,000 from the adopted FY 2021/22 Future Grants and/or Grant Contingency budget to newly created cost centers to record the grant activity.


