Modern Steak Patio Shade Canopy Narrative The proposed patio shade canopy at Modern Steak is comprised of eleven bands of laser cut steel panels that undulate from the ground, up to a central support, then continue up to the face of the mall structure. The laser cut steel panels have been perforated using a custom graphic design that emulates the dappled shadow play of the leaves of a tree. The perforated openings vary in size from small amorphic cuts to large expansive apertures that allow controlled sunlight to reach the patio. The entire canopy is powder-coated in a high-gloss white paint. The patio canopy is integrated with natural landscape at the sidewalk edge with trees growing through large rounded apertures along the southern face. Vines growing from grade planters encapsulate the fire elements on the patio. The canopy has indirect lighting that reflects down onto the diners inside, as well as emanating outward through the apertures with a general glow that enhances the perforations on an urban scale. Fire elements consisting of two large Roman brick clad hearth blocks carry steel beams against which the steel panel canopy system is supported. These double-sided fireplaces are located on each end of the patio (east and west). The Roman brick mass has been painted with flat sheen white paint to compliment the white steel canopy panels. The proposed façade of the restaurant will be clad with white, flat sheen painted Roman brick to a height that aligns with the main entry of the mall. The signage will be integrated into this brick element with front-lit cutout lettering. The main entry will utilize steel frames and wood doors with patterned glass.
