Review Methodologies

Review Methodologies

The City of Scottsdale maintains a business and resident friendly approach to new development and improvements to existing developments. In order to provide for flexibility in the review of Development Applications, and Applications for Permitting, the City of Scottsdale provides two methodologies from which an owner or agent may choose to have the City process the application. The methodologies are:

1. Enhanced Application Review Methodology

Within the parameters of the Regulatory Bill-of-Rights of the Arizona Revised Statutes, the Enhanced Application Review method is intended to increase the likelihood that the applicant will obtain an earlier favorable written decision or recommendation upon completion of the city's reviews. To accomplish this objective, the Enhanced Application Review allows:

- the applicant and City staff to maintain open and frequent communication (written, electronic, telephone, meeting, etc.) during the application review;
- City staff and the applicant to collaboratively work together regarding an application; and
- City staff to make requests for additional information and the applicant to submit revisions to address code, ordinance, or policy deficiencies in an expeditious manner.

Generally, the on-going communication and the collaborative work environment will allow the review of an application to be expedited within the published Staff Review Time frames.

2. Standard Application Review Methodology:

Under the Standard Application Review, the application is processed in accordance with the Regulatory Bill-of-Rights of the Arizona Revised Statutes. These provisions significantly minimize the applicant's ability to collaboratively work with City Staff to resolve application code, ordinance, or policy deficiencies during the review of an application. After the completion the city's review, a written approval or denial, recommendation of approval or denial, or a written request for additional information will be provided.

The City is not required to provide an applicant the opportunity to resolve application deficiencies, and staff is not permitted to discuss or request additional information that may otherwise resolve a deficiency during the time the City has the application. Since the applicant's ability to collaboratively work with Staff's to resolve deficiencies is limited, the total Staff Review Time and the likelihood of a written denial, or recommendation of denial is significantly increased.

In addition to the information above, please review the Development Application, and/or the Application for Permitting flow charts. These flow charts provide a step-by-step graphic representation of the application processes for the associated review methodologies.

Wireless Communication Facilities (WCF) Development Review/Conditional Use Permit Development Application Checklist

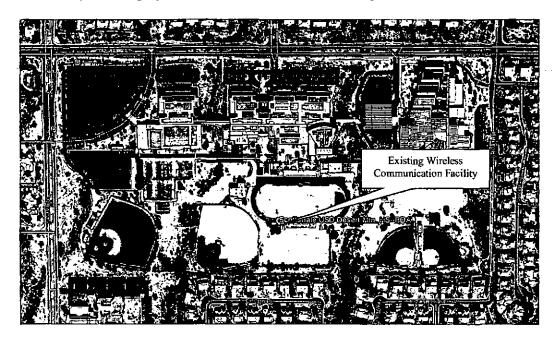

Existing Conditions

Sprint has an existing Wireless Communication Facility (WCF) located at Desert Mountain High School, 12575 E Via Linda. Currently, Sprint has antennas placed on a Ball Field Light pole on the southwest corner of the football field. There are three (3) antennas with radio heads mounted at 67' AGL. The ground equipment remains behind the existing CMU block wall enclosure.



Nature of Request

In response to changes in technology to its wireless services, and its commitment to provide service throughout this area, Sprint is requesting approval for the replacement of three (3) existing 72"x11.8"x7.9" antennas with three (3) new 76.9"x16.1"x11.8" antennas. An additional three (3) new Mini Macro Radios will be mounted at the same rad center behind the antennas. New antennas and tower mounted equipment will be painted to match the existing facility. Coax cables connecting the antennas to the equipment will be routed inside the existing pole. The proposed antennas will be bottomfed. Coax shrouds will also be installed, painted to match the existing facility.

Conclusion

It is the goal of Sprint to service the area with more reliable cellular service. By upgrading the existing antennas at this location, Verizon Wireless will be able to continue providing the best service to its customers.
