

DEVELOPMENT PROPOSAL

The applicant is requesting approval for two new pickleball courts and two new bocce ball courts to replace an existing croquet lawn at Terravita Country Club. Additionally, the applicant proposes to add twelve (12) foot tall noise reducing fencing around the pickleball courts to match the existing tennis courts. No new lighting is proposed.

The request was presented to the Development Review Board on July 15, 2021. The Board voted to continue the application to a later hearing date to allow the applicant additional time to address concerns regarding potential sound from the new courts.

The request was then presented to the Development Review Board on August 19, 2021. To address previous concerns, the sound engineer for the project, The Acoustic Group, and a subject matter expert engineer were present at the second hearing. The Board voted to continue the application to a later hearing date to allow the applicant additional time to meet with the Terravita homeowners to discuss concerns regarding sound from the new courts.

As of the writing of this report, staff has received over 290 comment letters in support of the request and over 110 comment letters in opposition of the request.

Development Review Board Criteria

Staff confirms that the development proposal generally meets the applicable Development Review Board Criteria. For a detailed analysis of the Criteria, please see Attachment #4.

STAFF RECOMMENDED ACTION

Staff recommends that the Development Review Board approve the Terravita Pickleball and Bocce Courts development proposal per the attached stipulations, finding that the Character and Design Element of the General Plan and Development Review Board Criteria have been met.



APPLICATION NARRATIVE

Project Name: Terravita Pickleball and Bocce Courts

Property Address: 34036 N. 69th Way, Scottsdale, AZ 85266

Terravita Country Club is applying to build pickleball and bocce courts on what is currently the club's croquet lawn. This area is in the center of the amenity campus and it is underutilized.

The construction of the 2 pickleball and 2 bocce courts would be complimentary to the existing structures in material used and color. Our plan is to add 10' fencing to the pickleball courts, which will match the existing tennis courts. The area is accessible by the current path and that will not change.

DEVELOPMENT REVIEW BOARD CRITERIA ANALYSIS

Per Section 1.904. of the Zoning Ordinance, in considering any application for development, the Development Review Board shall be guided by the following criteria:

- 1. The Board shall examine the design and theme of the application for consistency with the design and character components of the applicable guidelines, development standards, Design Standards and Policies Manual, master plans, character plan and General Plan.
 - The applicant states that the proposed pickleball fencing will match the existing tennis courts.
 - Staff finds that the proposal is consistent with the City's design guidelines.
- 2. The architectural character, landscaping and site design of the proposed development shall:
 - a. Promote a desirable relationship of structures to one another, to open spaces and topography, both on the site and in the surrounding neighborhood;
 - b. Avoid excessive variety and monotonous repetition;
 - c. Recognize the unique climatic and other environmental factors of this region to respond to the Sonoran Desert environment, as specified in the Sensitive Design Principles;
 - d. Conform to the recommendations and guidelines in the Environmentally Sensitive Lands (ESL) Ordinance, in the ESL Overlay District; and
 - e. Incorporate unique or characteristic architectural features, including building height, size, shape, color, texture, setback or architectural details, in the Historic Property Overlay District.
 - The applicant states that the proposed pickleball fencing will match the existing tennis courts.
 - Staff finds that the proposal is consistent with the City's design guidelines.
- 3. Ingress, egress, internal traffic circulation, off-street parking facilities, loading and service areas and pedestrian ways shall be designed as to promote safety and convenience.
 - This criterion is not applicable.
- 4. If provided, mechanical equipment, appurtenances and utilities, and their associated screening shall be integral to the building design.
 - This criterion is not applicable.
- 5. Within the Downtown Area, building and site design shall:
 - a. Demonstrate conformance with the Downtown Plan Urban Design & Architectural Guidelines;
 - b. Incorporate urban and architectural design that address human scale and incorporate pedestrian-oriented environment at the street level;
 - Reflect contemporary and historic interpretations of Sonoran Desert architectural traditions, by subdividing the overall massing into smaller elements, expressing small scale details, and recessing fenestrations;
 - d. Reflect the design features and materials of the urban neighborhoods in which the development is located; and
 - e. Incorporate enhanced design and aesthetics of building mass, height, materials and intensity with transitions between adjacent/abutting Type 1 and Type 2 Areas, and adjacent/abutting Type 2 Areas and existing development outside the Downtown Area.
 - This criterion is not applicable.
- 6. The location of artwork provided in accordance with the Cultural Improvement Program or Public Art Program shall address the following criteria:
 - a. Accessibility to the public;

- b. Location near pedestrian circulation routes consistent with existing or future development or natural features;
- c. Location near the primary pedestrian or vehicular entrance of a development;
- d. Location in conformance with Design Standards and Policies Manual for locations affecting existing utilities, public utility easements, and vehicular sight distance requirements; and
- e. Location in conformance to standards for public safety.

DEVELOPMENT INFORMATION

Zoning History

The site was annexed into the City in 1984 (Ord. #1655) and zoned to the R1-43 zoning designation through case 2-Z-85. Since initial rezoning of the site, the site has been rezoned to R1-10 ESL and OS ESL through zoning case 59-ZN-1992.

Community Involvement

With the submittal of the application, staff notified all property owners within 750 feet of the site. In addition, the applicant has been in communication with property owners surrounding the site. As of the publishing of this report, staff has received over 400 public comment letters regarding the application. The public comment letters express over 290 letters in support of the request, 1 neutral comment, and over 110 letters in opposition of the request.

Context

The property is located west of North Scottsdale Road between East Carefree Highway on the north and the private road of East Terravita Way on the south. The site is situated in an area devoted almost exclusively to residential uses. Surrounding uses include single-family residential uses within the Terravita subdivision, single-family residential uses in the Town of Carefree to the north, multifamily residential uses to the east, single-family residential uses in Maricopa County to the south, and single-family residential uses to the west.




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

Dear Mr. Riffle

Terravita Country Club retained Acoustic Group Inc. (AGI) to update the 2014 and 2015 noise studies that were conducted to evaluate the noise generated by Pickleball play at the club. AGI has over 33 years of directly related past project experience, past work with Terravita Country Club and numerous other pickleball court projects where pickleball was added after the initial community development and noise level reduction was successfully obtained.

This study will predict the Pickleball noise level near houses that are adjacent to the tennis court area. The noise level from Pickleball play will be evaluated based on several noise control measures including 1) locating the Pickleball courts at a new location further away from the homes 2) evaluation of noise control material around the court at an appropriate height to reduce propagation 3) use of new pickleball equipment (rackets) specifically designed to reduce noise and 4) orientation of the direction of the courts to minimize noise. The results of this study provides a comparison of the actual measured sound levels when play was measured on several different courts in 2014, to the predicted value of the sound levels at the same locations with each of the four (4) noise reduction measures outlined above.



NOISE AND THE A-WEIGHTED SOUND LEVEL

Noise is most often defined as unwanted sound. Although sound can be easily measured, the perceptibility is subjective and the physical response to sound complicates the analysis of its impact on people. People judge the relative magnitude of sound sensation in subjective terms such as "noisiness" or "loudness." Sound pressure magnitude is measured and quantified using a logarithmic ratio of pressures, the scale of which gives the level of sound in decibels (dB).


The human hearing system is not equally sensitive to sound at all frequencies. Therefore, to approximate this human, frequency-dependent response, the A-weighting filter system is used to adjust measured sound levels. The A-weighted sound level is expressed in "dBA" or "dB(A)." Figure 1 provides typical A-weighted sound levels measured for various sources, as well as people's responses to these levels.

When sound is measured for distinct time intervals, the statistical distribution of the overall sound level can be obtained during that period. The energy-equivalent sound level (Leq) is the most common parameter associated with such measurements. The Leq metric is a single-number noise descriptor which represents the average sound level over a given period of time, where the actual sound level varies with time. Lmax, Lmin, and Lxx are also common noise descriptors. Lmax and Lmin are the maximum and minimum noise levels, respectively, and Lxx, known as a statistical sound level, is the time-varying noise level which would be exceeded xx percent of the time.

NOISE STANDARDS & GUIDELINES

The City of Scottsdale Municipal Code does not specifically adopt noise standards to regulate noise from recreational activity within parks. However, an appropriate noise level limit would be 50 - 55 dBA at outdoor living areas. The acceptance of any noise guideline would be subject to the approval of the HOA board and or the City of Scottsdale.

SUMMARY OF 2014 STUDY




Figure 2. Location of the Noise Measurements

AGI previously conducted a noise survey on February 17, 2014 to document the noise levels from Tennis and Pickleball activities at the Terravita Tennis and Pickleball Courts¹. Hourly noise measurements were conducted at the rear yard of 6847 E Amber Sun Drive (NM1). Hourly noise measurements were also conducted along the rear yard fence of 6863 E Amber Sun Drive (NM2). The measurement was conducted with a Larson Davis Model 831 Noise Analyzer and the instrument was operated in accordance with manufacturer's standards. Figure 2 shows the location of the noise measurement relative to the Tennis and Pickleball courts and the nearby residences.

The Leq measured during the survey ranged from 40.4 to 45.4 dBA at NM1. The sources of noise that contributed to the measurement data were tennis and pickleball play, basketball play, distant traffic, wildlife birds, aircraft, talking, and homeowner activity. At location NM2, the Leq ranged from 46.9 to 48.3 dBA. Noise from tennis and pickleball play, basketball play, distant traffic, wildlife birds, aircraft, talking, and homeowner activity also were measured at this location. Table 1 summarizes the noise measurement data. Table 2 summarizes the noise from individual noise events measured at each location.

Tennis Noise

Noise associated with Tennis play was measured at locations NM1 and NM2 during the survey. During the tennis play, all 6 courts were active with doubles play at each court. There were a total of 24 players on the courts during the survey. At location NM1, tennis ball impact noise ranged from 40 to 58 dBA. At location NM2, tennis ball impact noise ranged from 39 to 53 dBA. Players talking and shouting were also noticeable noise sources at each location. Talking generated noise levels ranging from 40 to 55 dBA at NM1 and 37 to 42 dBA at NM2. Shouting generated noise levels at approximately 65 dBA at NM1.

Pickleball Noise

Noise associated with Pickleball play was measured at locations NM1 and NM2 during the survey. During the pickleball play, Court 6 was active with doubles play at each pickleball court. There were a total of 8 players on the courts during the survey. At location NM1, pickleball impact noise ranged from 39 to 53 dBA. At location NM2, pickleball ball impact noise ranged from 47 to 65 dBA. Players talking were also a noticeable noise source at each location. Talking generated noise levels ranging from 35 to 57 dBA at NM1 and 45 to 52 dBA at NM2.

Basketball Noise

Noise associated with basketball play was measured at locations NM1 and NM2 during the survey. Basketball play was demonstrated by one player located at Court 6. At location NM1, basketball impact noise ranged from 35 to 54 dBA. At location NM2, basketball impact noise ranged from 39 to 65 dBA.

Other Noise

Other noise sources experienced at NM1 and NM2 included birds, homeowners, aircraft, golf carts, cars, and trucks. Overall, at both measurement locations the ambient noise was 35 dBA. Birds created sound levels of 45 to 53 dBA. Nearby homeowners created sound levels ranging from 38 to 62 dBA. Aircrafts passing generated a sound level ranging from 42 to 53 dBA. A golf cart passing has a sound level of 45 dBA. A car passing has a sound level ranging from 42 to 45 dBA. Trucks passing had a sound level of 58 dBA. Based on the results of the noise survey, the noise from the pickleball and tennis courts had a range of sound levels ranging from 35 to 65 dBA.



SUMMARY OF 2015 STUDY

The noise from the proposed Pickleball activity at Court #5 was previously analyzed in AGI's 2015 noise study². Table 3 summarizes the results of the previous noise analysis. The noise associated with pickleball activity at Court #5 are within the 50 to 55 dBA guideline for residential noise impact assessment at R1 and R4 – R6. The noise at R2 and R2 are above the guideline. However, based on the noise measurement data, the background noise at the residences is relatively low at around 35 dBA, and pickleball noise levels would be audible and clearly discernible to the nearest homeowners on E Amber Sun Drive.

NEW PICKLEBALL LOCATION NOISE ANALYSIS

For the 2015 Court #5 study and the new pickleball location analysis, the methodology used to analyze and predict operations noise involved the use of the CadnaA computer noise model. CadnaA can simulate the physical environment by factoring in x, y, and z geometrics of a particular site to simulate the buildings, obstacles, and typography. The model uses industry recognized algorithms (ISO 9613) to perform acoustical analyses. The noise generated by future pickleball courts were calculated by inputting acoustical sources at the project site. AGI's measurement data from the pickleball noise measurements were used for the modeling inputs. The CadnaA Noise Model was also used to evaluate noise control options. This model has been validated by over 15 years and millions of successful test cases around the world.

AGI has analyzed the noise from the proposed Pickleball activity at the new proposed location shown in Figure 3. With no noise barriers, the future pickleball courts would produce noise levels ranging from 41.4 to 46.0 dBA at the nearest noise sensitive receptors. Table 4 summarizes the predicted pickleball noise levels at the nearest noise sensitive receptors.

Based on the noise measurement data from tennis and pickleball play, the noise associated with these activities are below the 50 to 55 dBA guideline for residential noise impact assessment. However, the background noise at the residences is relatively low at around 35 dBA, and pickleball noise levels would still be clearly discernible to the nearest homeowners on E Amber Sun Drive.

Compared to locating the pickleball courts on Court #5, the new pickleball court location further from the residences will result in a significantly noticeable reduction of noise levels ranging from 5.1 to 13.6 dB. Refer to Table 5 for a comparison of the pickleball noise levels from Court #5 and the new proposed pickleball location.

Noise Control

The following measures were evaluated to minimize pickleball noise at the nearest homes from the proposed Pickleball Courts:

Noise Control Option 1




Figure 4. Recommended Noise Barrier Location

As the recommended option, a continuous solid noise barrier should be installed on the western and northern boundary of the pickleball courts as per Figure 4. Materials such as concrete block, plexiglass, or acoustical blanket (e.g. Acoustical Solutions Noise S.T.O.P Soundproof Blanket STC 33, NRC 0.75) should be used to provide the sound transmission needed. Figure 4 displays the recommended noise barrier location relative to the noise sensitive receivers. Table 6 summarizes the results of the noise barrier analysis.

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Based on the results summarized in Table 6, a noise barrier of at least 12-feet in height is needed to provide a noticeable noise reduction at the nearby residences represented by Receptors 1 through 6. With a 12-foot high noise barrier, locating the new pickleball courts would result in noise levels of 33.5, 37.3, 37.8, 37.9, 36.4, and 36.0 dBA, at receptors R1 through R6, respectively. Compared to locating the pickleball courts on Court #5, the new pickleball courts with a 12-ft high solid noise barrier will result in noise levels ranging from 10.6 to 21.9 dB less than then noise levels from Court #5. Refer to Table 7 for a comparison of the pickleball noise levels from Court #5 and the new proposed pickleball location with the 12-foot high solid noise barrier.

With the solid 12-foot high barrier, the pickleball noise would be below the 50 to 55 dBA guidelines for residential noise impact assessment. Additionally, the pickleball noise levels would less than 3 dB higher than the ambient noise level at around 35 dBA. Because of the characteristics of the Pickleball impact noise, the sounds will be audible to the nearest residences.




Figure 5. Recommended Acoustical Fencing Location Surrounding Pickleball Courts

As an alternative to Option 1, install lightweight acoustical fencing (Acoustiblok or AcoustiFence) to the north, east, west, and south sides of the chain link fence surrounding the pickleball courts, as per Figure 5. The AcoustiFence (Figure 6), or acoustical equivalent should provide a minimum STC 28 rating or greater. The estimated barrier insertion loss values are consistent with AGI's field observations at similar pickleball facilities. Table 8 summarizes the pickleball noise levels with acoustical fencing surrounding the courts.

Based on the results summarized in Table 8, acoustical fencing of at least 12-feet in height is needed to provide a noticeable noise reduction at the nearby residences represented by Receptors 1 through 6. With a 12-foot high noise barrier, locating the new pickleball courts would result in noise levels of 36.8, 40.9, 41.3, 41.1, 39.1, and 36.4 dBA, at receptors R1 through R6, respectively. Compared to a solid noise barrier, acoustical fencing does not provide as significant amount of noise reduction.

Compared to locating the pickleball courts on Court #5, the new pickleball courts with a 12-ft high acoustic fencing will result in noise levels ranging from 10.2 to 18.3 dB less than then noise levels from Court #5. Refer to Table 7 for a comparison of the pickleball noise levels from Court #5 and the new proposed pickleball location with the 12-foot high acoustic fencing.

With the 12-foot high acoustic fencing, the pickleball noise would be below the 50 to 55 dBA guidelines for residential noise impact assessment. However, the pickleball noise levels would be approximately 6 dB higher than the ambient noise level at around 35 dBA and audible to the nearest residences.

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Noise Control Option 3

In addition to either Noise Control Option 1 or Noise Control Option 2, Terravita Country Club could enforce the requirement of the newer "Quietest" or "Quieter" Pickleball paddles. Table 10 lists the noise levels from pickleball paddles. Depending on the equipment type used, the noise level from pickleball noise could be reduced by 5.4 to 7.7 dB.

Noise Control Option 4

Depending on the orientation of the Pickleball Courts, the noise produced by the ball and paddle impact can exhibit a small amount of directivity. The noise experienced along the baseline of the Pickleball Courts can be approximately 2 dB higher than the noise along the sideline directions. To minimize the affect of directivity, the courts can be orientated such that the sidelines face the nearest residences and thus further reduce the noise in the direction of the nearest homes. This would involve an approximately 90-degree rotation of the courts.



SUMMARY OF NOISE CONTROL OPTIONS

Compared to locating the pickleball courts on Court #5, the new pickleball courts with a 12-ft high solid noise barrier will result in noise levels ranging from 10.6 to 21.9 dB less than then noise levels from Court #5. Compared to locating the pickleball courts on Court #5, the new pickleball courts with a 12-ft high acoustic fencing will result in noise levels ranging from 10.2 to 18.3 dB less than then noise levels from Court #5. Compared to a solid noise barrier, acoustical fencing does not provide as significant amount of noise reduction. Depending on the equipment type used, the noise level from using newer "Quietest" or "Quieter" pickleball paddles could be reduced 5.4 to 7.7 dB. Additionally, if the angle of the proposed courts was rotated 90 degrees, noise levels could be reduced an additional 2 dB. Table 11 summarizes the noise control options evaluated for the new pickleball location.

RECOMMENDATIONS

The following recommendations are identified to provide a substantial reduction of the pickleball noise at the nearest residences:

- 1. A 12-foot high noise barrier (barrier height is relative to the court elevation) should be constructed along the western and northern boundary of the pickleball courts as shown in Figure 4, to reduce the pickleball noise at Receptors 1 through 6. Materials such as concrete block, plexiglass, or acoustical blanket (e.g. Acoustical Solutions Noise S.T.O.P Soundproof Blanket STC 33, NRC 0.75) should be used to provide the sound transmission needed.
- 2. As an alternative, a 12-ft high acoustical fencing (acoustical fencing height is relative to the court elevation) can be constructed surrounding the proposed pickle court location as shown in Figure 5. Acoustiblok, AcoustiFence,or acoustical equivalent should provide a minimum STC 28 rating or greater.
- 3. Require pickleball players to use the newest "Quietest" or "Quieter" paddles. Require an inspection of the paddles and ball prior to begin of play.
- 4. Rotate the design of the Pickleball Courts by 90 degrees, so that the baselines are perpendicular to the residences to the North.
- 5. Consider limiting the days and hours of pickleball play to time periods that are less intrusive to nearby homeowners.

6. The engineering design of the noise barrier should be reviewed by a licensed engineer to ensure compliance with all applicable codes.

CONCLUSION

AGI has analyzed the pickleball noise from the new proposed pickleball courts and the potential noise reduction that could be achieved with a noise barrier along the western and northern edge of the courts or acoustical fencing surrounding the courts. The analysis has determined that a 12-foot high noise barrier would provide a significant and substantial noise reduction compared to the no noise barrier case. Alternatively, a 12-ft high acoustical fencing would provide a clearly noticeable noise reduction compared to the no noise barrier case. Requiring pickleball players to use quiet paddles and rotation of the court by 90 degrees would further reduce noise levels. Because the Terra Vita community to located in a quiet ambient environment, noise from the pickleball play will not be reduced to an inaudible level by constructing a noise barrier and additional noise control measures. However, the recommended noise control options could be collectively employed to provide a substantial reduction in the pickleball noise.

Last Monday we had the opportunity to present to the TCC Board of Directors our progress as the ad hoc Pickleball Planning Committee, as it relates to recommending a site and plans for Pickleball at Terravita. Q: Has a variance request been proposed to the government entity (Scottsdale) that said, "No," to pickleball courts in our existing parking lot? **A:** No, we have not approached the City, but we have talked to several contractors, PHX Architects and Troon's advisor, all familiar with permitting within Terravita and they have made it clear that the sites would be problematic due to loss of parking spaces, the proximity to the wash and the existing curb cuts that allow for ingress and egress for emergency vehicles. To request a variance, we would also have to incur expenses for a survey and improvement plans submit engineering plans (budgeted at \$20 - \$25,000).

Q: What is the proposed Pickle ball usage? **A:** Playing time has yet to be determined but the thought is not later than 5 - 6 pm.

Q: Richele your comment about a rendering is so important. The aesthetics of that beautiful grassy area is going to be totally changed, we need to know what it is going to look like. With 12 foot walls it is hard to imagine what that will look like. **A:** We hope to have renderings within the next several weeks of the grassy area, pool walk-way perspective and the Desert Pavilion showing proposed changes. We are not intending to build a 12 FT. wall. We will use fencing just like the tennis court fencing.

Q: I believe we should have an artist rendering done of the courts as placed in the grassy area. Lot of discussion about noise, but negative aesthetic impact if the courts is equally or even more important because many residents in Terravita use the pool and fitness center and tennis courts combined. Many more than will play pickle ball. **A:** We hope to have renderings within the next several weeks of the grassy area, pool walk-way

perspective and the Desert Pavilion showing proposed changes.

Q: What happens to the Tennis Center Office and storage area? **A:** The thought is that Terry's office will be altered for F&B services as there is available space and an existing service window.

Q: Will the pickleball courts be lighted? A: No lights are planned.

Q: Does the current proposed site have enough room for 2 additional courts? **A:** The survey will tell us the usable area of the grassy area.

Q: Why is so much time spent on noise studies and presentations when the location of the proposed PB courts is going to receive much resident pushback. The current central park is key to the lovely esthetic of Terravita. **A:** We spent a lot of time on noise because that was the primary objection 6 years ago. The committee was sensitive to the Central park - and will relocate it and have an equivalent area, that maybe more functional with the Patio of the Desert Pavilion. We think it can be an added amenity to utilize the DP meeting rooms for special events.

Q: While decibel level has been studied, has the nature of the noise been studied? For example, loud birds may not annoy, while quieter machinery or other types of sound may be more annoying than loud bird singing (for example). **A:** Conventional wisdom tends to identify new sounds tend to be "annoying". Like living on busy street or in a city - it becomes background noise if at lower Db. As opposed to machine or plane where your voice is overcome by the noise - and conversation cannot be heard.

Q: Why not put the noise reduction wall between the tennis courts and the homes to provide relief from both for the homeowners who are affected? **A:** Apparently there is no current complaint from homeowners about tennis noise however the committee could recommend added sound mitigation measures around the perimeter of the tennis courts (sides closest to homes) for added reduction from Tennis and other noises.

Q: Did the consultant provide a frequency spectrum of pickleball noise? (usually measured in Hertz). dBA is a very specific measure of noise - one of many scales to measure noise and may not be the appropriate scale to measure this noise. **A:** We dealt with a very well qualified and experienced expert and he chose this method to measure the pickleball sounds. The Consultant did not spend much time on Frequency spectrum. The committee did look at other sound studies conducted for Sun City and other pickle ball data. The pickle ball sound is mostly in the 1000 -2000hz level. They characterize a sharp hit (sounds like a ping) and dull hit. The Duration or dwell of the sound peaks in the sharp hit at the 1000 hz, and the dull hit is more spread out. Sound mitigation techniques work well for this frequency.

Q: Have we considered the sound relative to people sitting at the pool, playing tennis, or just sitting close by? Also, have you considered the combined impact on those homes of all activities together - pickleball, tennis, pool, etc. **A:** The residents have not complained about tennis noise or pool noise.

Q: Have you studied the decibel levels affecting the pool area? If you are constructing the sound barriers on the tennis court side and not on the pool side of the courts, what will the decibel level be for those who are enjoying the quiet and serenity of the pool area? **A:** The sound mitigation blankets can likewise be placed in locations to reduce sound transmission to the pool.

Q: Regarding the noise level study: This study only takes into acct. just playing the game. What is the impact on those using the pool and tennis play: The study does not measure the noise level of those watching others play or the noise level of all those drawn to the areal for pickle ball, bocci ball and enhanced food and beverage amenities? **A:** The sound analysis included the recording of conversation dBA's from players on both the tennis and pickleball courts. See Slide Deck measurements.

Q: Please address the noise decibels that will be experienced from the pool area. **A:** The sound mitigation blankets can likewise be placed in locations to reduce sound transmission to the pool. There have been discussions about adding a splashing water fountain feature to help minimize sound.

Q: Does it make sense to build the courts without the fence and then put it in if sound is an issue. **A:** Yes, this is possible but within the budget we want to have sufficient funds to cover possible remedies for sound.

Q: What is the current Tennis Court Usage? **A:** We are only addressing PB concerns at this time.

Q: What is the current Tennis Court Usage? What is the proposed Pickle Ball usage? Why can't you convert two tennis courts to pickle ball courts? **A:** Pickleball on the tennis courts were studied five years ago and was believed to be too loud, the grassy area is four times further away than tennis court #5 and provides for better reduced sound.

Q: This may be premature. Regarding the "approved" paddles.... Sun City Grand produces an annual "approved" paddle list. Could Terravita simply adopt their listing - as it is quite extensive. **A:** Yes, we would follow and adopt a similar program.

Q: Only fences have been discussed as sound barriers. What about the possibility of concrete walls being installed? **A:** A concrete wall is an option has a very small beneficial

(<3dB) impact to sound dampening. There is also safety concern though for the players with this hard of a finish. Also, the aesthetics of 10-foot wall would not be consistent with the Tennis fences.

- **Q:** Now that you're discussing destroying the most beautiful, useable grassy area in our community...and squeezing in pickleball courts...by building 12 foot high walls, how are you planning to prevent that entire area from now looking like mid-town Manhattan, with all the extra noise and congestion that NYC has? You're creating exactly what many of us moved to Terravita to get away from...the look and feel of an inner city! **A:** Renderings are being prepared to help visualize the improvements in the grassy area.
- **Q:** If the TGA owns the property at the back of the DP. What is the plan as far as acquiring this for replacement of the grass area that is being taken over by pickle ball? When will this grass area be developed? **A:** TCC owns some land behind the Desert Pavilion...a rendering is being prepared to help visualize the improvements proposed.
- **Q:** Why would we spend money to build pickle ball in the current great area, and more money to build a new Grassy area? Why not just put pickle ball at the DP site and leave the current grassy area as is? This eliminates many of the negatives of installing pickle ball near the pool. Also save a lot of money. **A:** There is not enough land owned by TCC to build pickleball courts behind the Desert Pavilion.
- **Q:** Have you contacted the Golf Club to see it they would offer a variance to get you more 'grass area' south? **A:** That is an option but TCC owns land approximately equivalent to the grassy area behind the Desert Pavilion.
- **Q:** Mike Gass didn't answer when the new grass area will be developed. **A:** Development can progress at the same time as the pickleball would be built.
- **Q:** What about the quiet experience at the pool being ruined. **A:** The sound mitigation blankets can likewise be placed in locations to reduce sound transmission to the pool.
- **Q:** Did you interview/talk with pool users to see if they think the pickle ball noise would negatively impact relaxing by the pool. **A:** Yes, we heard guest testimony, at one of the committee meetings, that felt that pool users will not be offended by pickleball.
- **Q:** Does the budget as presented include the building of the new grassy area by the DP? Both items need to be budgeted for, not just pickle ball. **A:** Yes, the preliminary budget includes \$25,000 for the new grassy area development by the DP.
- **Q:** Isn't it premature to spend more money without agreement on the location. **A:** The PB committee is recommending only one location for approval, the other sites considered

have issues with closeness to homes, loss of parking spaces that would cause us to be out of compliance with building codes, three sites considered are not owned by TCC and are not available for purchase.

Q: Why not enlist a landscape architect to be a part of this project. **A:** The design firm will have landscape architect expertise included on the project design. City plans submittals require us to include landscape recommendations.

Q: Given the proposed cost in excess of 1/4 million dollars will this require a membership vote? **A:** No, the TCC Board of Directors will vote.

Q: Would it not make more sense to have the town halls before any additional funds are approved in case the sense of the community is to not approve? **A:** The pickleball committee's purpose is to recommend one site and develop a plan for a vote of the TCC Board for approval (or disapproval). The next step in the planning process is the survey and improvement plan to develop an overall cost of the project. We put forth a motion to continue with the planning process and the TCC Board approved.

Q: Shouldn't we put it out to the community before doing surveys ... maybe some preliminary work only. A: No, the TCC Board of Directors will vote.

Q: What is the required maintenance of sound deadening materials and what is the life of said material. **A:** The Materials are designed for outdoor use. Like the tennis windscreens they will need to be replaced on a regular basis 5-10 year cycles). Clubs that have installed material have had them in place in excess of five years and do not show excess wear.

Q: Who will manage the Pickleball court hours, participants and reservations? **A:** Pickleball will be given direction by the Tennis Committee and managed through our current Troon staff.

Q: That is not true that some parking areas are closer to homes according to the map of proposed pb in the parking lot that you showed us. Will you show the map again? **A:** The aerial map showing site locations can be found in the Slide Deck saved on the TCC website.

Q: Would the Board please approve money for a landscape architect since the visual of this project is as important as the noise pollution aspect? **A:** Yes, submission of improvement plans to the City will include landscaping plans too.

Q: Is this board aware that one resident family behind the proposed PB courts has their home for sale strictly because of the PB court serious proposal? They attended the ad hoc

meeting and opposed the courts based upon noise concerns. **A:** Yes, we have been told (not by the homeowner).

Q: Will the board please postpone any decision regarding the building of PB courts -- including feasibility study money (\$25,000) until AFTER due diligence query to homeowner's ability to weigh in at meetings they can attend in person? Many will not use zoom and this is a big capital expenditure. **A:** We are planning four in-person town hall meetings for February 25th and 26th (3 pm and 5 pm). The town hall meetings will be limited to 40 guests at one time (plus 10 Board and Committee members too).

Dear Ms. Mayo,

As a long time resident at Terravita(25 years), we have had the issue of Pickleball come up over and over again. In fact, it was tried on our tennis courts and the irritating noise could be heard over our television with the doors and windows closed. I invited the then current board over to hear it, and they all agreed that the noise was terribly loud and penetrating and they wouldn't want to live near it. They respected the homeowners complaints and voted to discontinue play on the courts immediately and try to find a more desirable place at Terravita. They selected a committee to study other options. The club paid for engineers to look at different areas and after extensive study it was determined that there was no place near the club house that wouldn't disturb residents and pool enthusiasts that look to that area for relaxation. It was then voted that the committee disband and the issue of pickleball was finally put to rest.

Now we have a new board made up of a number of pickleball supporters that used this time of no live meeting participation due to the pandemic to usher in a vote (4-3) for two new pickleball courts within 100-200 yards of many of our homes. We continually asked that they delay the vote so we could have membership present and that we could have some more noise studies done using the proposed noise mitigating curtain. We asked that they try the curtain first before they tear-up our only grassy area which many consider their "central park" and use as a gathering place. A concern of ours was when temperatures reach in the upper 90s and 100s how long will the heat be tolerated without cross ventilation and the curtains be taken down. To my knowledge, there is no place in Scottsdale or Phoenix that is using this method of noise abatement and when asked, I was told there is some place in Newport Beach, California using it. We requested that the board vote be delayed until some of these concerns were addressed but the vote was taken in February in a "closed" meeting due to Covid restrictions

We live at 6831 E. Amber Sun Drive and paid a premium for our lot so that we might enjoy all the amenities of being close to the clubhouse. We have since been told that due to the proximity of these proposed courts to our home, we might lose between \$40,000-\$50,000 if we are able to sell it. We knew we had tennis courts and a pool near our home but that noise has never been an issue. We love having fun and enjoy others having fun but our experience with pickleball brings us to a whole new level of tolerance. Not only do you deal with the quick repetitive noise(like racquetball) but it is the loud party-like atmosphere from the players and surrounding players. Please note that in the request they also plan to have a patio and seating area surrounding these courts with food and drinks thus encouraging more Noise.

We have 1,380 homes in Terravita which means these courts will be used day and night and still won't satisfy the need for more courts. We have been told that there is a park area within a mile that plans for 6 Pickleball courts to be built, with the possibility of more being built depending on need. We are hoping that if this project at Terravita is delayed pickleball supporters might find this a great option.

My husband and I ask that you please consider us as well as our neighbors living near this project when you are reviewing this Terravita Request for approval. It does appear that you are our last best hope. All we want is the right and ability to enjoy our homes, protect their value and continue our wonderful life in Scottsdale.

Dear Mr. Sharrard:

This letter is in reference to the "planned" new pickleball courts for Terravita in Scottsdale, Arizona.

As a resident of this community for five years, I have <u>major concerns</u> about the pickleball courts that are being planned to be built in this subdivision.

My concerns include:

- 1. Noise: The decibels of pickleball are louder than tennis due to the popping sound that comes from the pickleball paddle. The materials used in the making of pickleball balls and paddles make that sound. And even with a shot without much effort behind it, the sound is quite LOUD.
- 2. Noise Traveling: Desert terrain allows the sound to travel pretty far. If it's in an open valley, give it 3 miles to dissipate. I have included a map with the proposed location of the new Courts along with the location of my house. NOTE: From my backyard the proposed courts is "all open desert terrain". I can hear the tennis courts from my backyard now, so there would be no problem with pickleball being louder.
- 3. Swimming Pool: The community swimming pool is a valued amenity to this subdivision. It has four lap lanes and large area around the pool for relaxing and enjoying time outdoors. The proposed location of the pickleball court will be DIRECTLY ADJACENT to the pool. There will be no more quiet book reading and relaxing by the pool. See map included for location of pool.

This is definitely going to negatively impact any future sale of my residence by the noise this generated. Having been in real estate for over 30 years, I know exactly what this will do to myself and many other residents in Terravita.

There are multiple available courts in our area: Cholla Park, Horizon Park and Carefree Resort. I would suggest anyone that enjoys playing pickleball contact one of these options.

I also wonder how many full time and part-time residents will play racquetball. The community was never surveyed!



Hi Drew, I just wanted to share my thoughts on Terravita Pickleball. We moved to Terravita in 2014. I wasn't playing pickleball at that time. My first experience playing was with my in-laws in Brevard North Carolina. I have played almost every racquet sport and I immediately became addicted. When I returned to Terravita I played for the first and last time on one of our tennis courts because the next day our Board suspended Pickleball indefinitely.

A few years ago the Board asked me to be Terravita's representative to the non-profit Sonoran Pickleball and Recreation Centers(SPARC). I joined and became the Communications Director. Working with SPARC gave me a chance to interact with other North Scottsdale communities . Sincuidados, Bellasera, Winfield, Whisper Rock.Estancia,Legend Trail,Desert Mountain,The Boulders and Mirabel all have Pickleball Courts and many of them were built recently. The popularity of the fastest growing sport in the country helped SPARC make the Sevano Village Park (Ashler Hill Park) the top priority on the recent city bond issue. I just wanted to bring you up to date on what's been happening with the Terravita Pickleball issue since we last met ... and since the Board voted to accept the Ad Hoc Committee recommendation.

While many expected the Board to unanimously approve the proposal, our hard work, dedication and determination to have our voices heard resulted in a much closer vote (4-3) than most anticipated. That razor thin vote of approval provided the impetus we needed to keep moving forward, knowing that our efforts were truly having an impact.

Since then, we've voiced many of our concerns to the city of Scottsdale Planning Department. Those concerns certainly caught the city's attention and triggered the Department to schedule a public hearing to review the plans submitted to the city by TCC. The city will be announcing the actual hearing date soon. They tell us it will probably be held in June.

It will actually be a virtual hearing. So, anyone who wants to watch it live can easily do so virtually, from anywhere in the country. I believe viewers will also be allowed to provide commentary and ask questions during the hearing, from the comfort of their homes.

More importantly, the Planning Department actually welcomes input from Terravita residents who have concerns about the construction of pickleball courts on our grass park. Input can be submitted either prior to the hearing, or during the meeting itself.

To help push our cause forward, Deb Lewis, Anne McDonald, Ilene Shapiro, Scott and Cherie Walker, and I have been personally asking Terravita friends and neighbors to take action and actively participate in our campaign. We're giving

them the attached letter and asking them to write and submit their thoughts through an email letter. The attachment outlines very specific instructions on the procedure they should follow.

Now we need your help.

Will you please share the letter with as many friends and neighbors as possible and encourage them to help us preserve the beauty of the current grass park ... and protect the peace and serenity it provides to neighboring homes, members relaxing at the pool, members playing tennis and members enjoying daily social gatherings.

The more letters we accumulate, and present to the Planning Department, the more effective we will be.

Lastly, knowing that many Terravita members will be leaving for the summer soon, it's important to take action quickly. Please contact your friends and neighbors now and have them send their email letters to me within the next two weeks.

DEAR CHAD,

My husband and I have been residents of Terravita since 2002. We love this community and especially the amenities. We were disheartened when we leaned that The TCC is planning on placing 2 pickle ball courts so close to homes on Amber Sun, the pool and tennis courts. This quiet space serves as an oasis for pool lovers, tennis players and is a buffer zone for the homes close by on Amber Sun.

The TCC Country Club retained Acoutics Group Inc. (AGI) to update the 2014 and 2015 noise study that was conducted to evaluate the noise generated by Pickleball play at the club. The study predicted the Pickleball noise level near houses that are adjacent to the tennis court area. Five recommendations were made by AGI to reduce the decibles of pickleball play. An Ad Hoc Committee appointed by the TCC Board of Directors looked at this study and presented their recommendations to the Board.

TCC subsequently scheduled Town Hall meetings to present the recommendations of the Ad Hoc Committee to the community. It was evident that the Ad Hoc Committee altered the recommendations of this study. The Ad Hoc recommendations did not represent the options put forth by the AGI study. The Ad Hoc committee ammended AGI's recommendations and made arbitrary changes that will adversly affect sound mitigation. The Ad Hoc Committee recommended the height of the fencing be changed from 12 feet to 10 feet. The committee recommended that only 1-2 sides be covered acoustic blankets instead of all 4 sides. The other recommendations were not addressed as to how they would be implemented ie inspection of paddles and monitoring hours of play. These arbitrary changes will adversly affect the desired sound mitagtion that would have been achieved by following AGI's recommendations.

Here are AGI's 5 recommendations in black ink and the Ad Hoc Committee's altered recommendations in red ink.(page 19)

The following recommendations are identified to provide a substantial reduction of the pickleball noise at the nearest residences.

1. A 12-foot-high noise barrier (barrier height is relative to the court elevation) should be constructed along the western and northern boundary of the pickleball courts as shown in Figure 4, to reduce the pickleball noise at Receptors 1 and 6. Materials such as concrete block, plexiglass, or acoustical blanket (e.g., Acoustical Solutions Noise S.T.O.P. Soundproof Blanket STC 33, NRC 0.75) should be used to provide the sound transmission needed.

This option was not approved by the Ad Hoc Committee.

2. As an alternative, a 12-ft high acoustical fencing (acoustical fencing height is relative to the court elevation) can be constructed surrounding the proposed pickleball court location as shown in Figure 5. Acoustiblok, AcoustiFence or acoustical equivalent should provide a minimum STC 28 rating or greater

The Ad Hoc committee arbitrarily recommended reducing the height of the fence from 12 feet to 10 feet. The committee also arbitrarily recommended that only 1-2 sides of the surrounding fence would be covered with acoustic blankets instead of AIG's recommendation that all sides be completely surrounded.

3. Require Pickleball players to use the newest "quietest" or "Quieter" paddles. Require an inspection of the paddles and ball prior to being of play.

There was no mention as to how this inspection was going to be monitored prior to the beginning of play.

4. Rotate the design of the Pickleball Courts by 90 degrees, so that the baselines are perpendicular to the residences to the North.

This recommendation was not approved by the Ad Hoc Committee. Instead, the courts are oriented in a north and south direction with the baselines facing north, directly toward the tennis courts and homes on Amber Sun which are 200- 400 feet away from the courts. This orientation will direct the sound towards the homes. The north baseline side toward the homes will not be covered with acoustic blankets as recommended by AGI .

5. Consider limiting the days and hours of pickleball play to time periods that are less intrusive to nearby homeowners.

There were no data shared as to how the hours of play were going to be monitored i.e. if there is play before 8 a.m. after 5 p.m. who will monitor the prohibited of hours of play and how will it be prevented.

In summary the five recommendations put forth by AGI based on scientific evidence were either not considered or completely altered by the Ad Hoc committee.

- 1. The Ad Hoc did not consider Option 1.
- 2. The Committee altered vital recommendations to mitigate sound in option 2 and 4.
- 3. The Ad Hoc committee did not present data as far as implementation of option 3 and 5.

The TCC Board approved their recommendations. As a result of the Ad Hoc Committee arbitrarily altering the recommendations submitted by AGI and not basing these changes on sound data, the annoying sound of pickle ball will not be satisfactorily mitigated. Altering the recommendations based on a scientific study negates the AGI study altogether as these courts

have now been designed at the whim of the Ad Hoc Committee and not based on this scientific study. Vital sound mitigation options/recommendations were not considered and or deleted/altered.

This small green park was designed by Del Webb to be a quiet space. It is called a croquet court on their original design. It was not designed to cram two noisy pickleball courts among quiet amenities, the pool and tennis courts, and within 210 feet of the back yards of the beautiful homes on Amber Sun Drive. And, now that recommended sound mitigation has been deleted/altered by the Ad Hoc Committee, it will be a travesty to go forth with this plan. Pickleball would be an appropriate, popular amenity in Terravita but not at this location.

In years to come, Terravita invested in a remodel that allowed for a "beach access" into the shallow water. So thoughtful for handicap access or just aging seniors having difficulty navigating steps and ladders. That earlier Bd of directors had the dedication to meet the needs of all members.

While many residents may join the private golf club, others enjoy the several tennis courts or fitness center activities. That fitness center has had one remodel and will soon have an entire 2nd floor expansion. For many others, however, having benefit of open air pool and spa offers another large segment of Terravita's population the therapeutic health snd wellness benefits many doctors, including mine, prescribe. The quiet environment is conducive to stress reduction and relaxation of tight muscles. Haven't we all experienced those in this last year!

For those of us with chronic pain conditions, getting into the heated pool and Jacuzzi and having aerobic water classes offers such relief that others may not yet appreciate. Not every resident has a pool so the oversized one is greatly valued. The tranquil quiet of the entire pool campus against the majestic backdrop of Black Mountain was intentionally created by Del Webb architects and land designers to capture the motto, "The Harmony of Land and Life." That area was featured in all sales brochures and videos. It beckoned one and all to the "peaceful oasis in the desert." Being in that quiet environment of hushed voices soothed the body and soul, mind and spirit. Even after water exercise, many, many can be seen relaxing while reading and enjoying the fresh air.

That original vision MUST be preserved, valued and maintained for that segment of Terravita's

residents needing that respit and tranquility that soothes a myriad of medical conditions. The Golden Door Spa at nearby Boulders Resort profits greatly and depends upon the total quiet of that top spa's pool area to attract its wealthy clientele. How fortunate to have had the visionary Del Webb include a similar tranquil place within Terravita in a dedicated space well away from Scottsdale Rd heavy traffic noise!

So no traffic noise by design yet some would think that heavy repetitive, annoying sounds of a pickle ball court is acceptable? I don't think so.

Adding pickle ball to this calming area will literally "steal the soul" from Terravita's" Harmony of Land and Life "for all the pool goers. The continual, excessive and repetitive noise will exceed any current transient noise in all of Terravita. Human game noise will also be intrusive. The installation of "sound blankets" will further detract from the intentionally designed landscape and open views to Black Mountain. While tennis courts are located farther away from the pool area, they ARE far enough away that I have never heard any tennis balls hitting the court surfaces. Lush landscaping surrounds them as well.

Cities and towns have ordinances against noise. So should the highly desirable, luxury community of Terravita.

Of note......at least 6 pickle ball courts will be included in the approved N. Scottsdale park soon to be constructed within 3 miles of Terravita. One realtor, Scott Gaertner, is advocating for more in his newsletters. He advocates a public-private partnership to be created for that purpose. So there is a public option for more PiCKleBalL a short drive away. AND.....At no cost of money or peace and tranquility to Terravita residents and pool users.

The Board's close 4-3vote slightly in favor of PiCKleBalL reflects the strength of resident opposition to building the court within 60' of the pool spa area. The board put investigation \$ into the pickle ball Committee so then had a monetary stake in its approval. It seemed unfair to me then from that stand point. Most meetings were via Zoom because of Covid, and may not accurately exemplify the displeasure with building pickle ball close to the pool area. Suggestions were made to pursue other areas of Terravita.

One more consideration....

Those beautiful and larger homes on Amber Sun no doubt will be negatively impacted by the repetitive, loud noise. Decreased sale prices will then negatively affect the entire Terravita resales for as a few sell for less so will all others. Not fair in so many ways!

The importance of our exceptionally designed pool/spa campus for the peace it offers the mind and the health it offers the body cannot be overstated. First, in the Application Narrative you state that the grassy park area that is the proposed site for the pickleball and bocce courts is UNDERUTILIZED. See below for that narrative:

Terravita Country Club is applying to build pickleball and bocce courts on what is currently the club's croquet lawn. This area is in the center of the amenity campus and it is underutilized. The construction of the 2 pickleball and 2 bocce courts would be complimentary to the existing structures in material used and color. Our plan is to add 10' fencing to the pickleball courts, which will match the existing tennis courts. The area is accessible by the current path and that will not change.

That, as you know, is a gross lie. This grassy park area -- the only one in this community of 1,380 homes -- is so highly utilized that you chose to appease the many residents who use and enjoy the park by creating another park near the Desert Pavillion. Though, that new proposed park will not be nearly as favorable as the current grassy park area. Besides its current heavy use, the current park is in an area that is an important buffer for the rest of the surrounding development and was designed as such by the original builder of Terravita.

Secondly, it's abhorrent that you presented extensive detail about sound mitigation of the PB courts to the Terravita residents who were willing to

Building pickleball courts in this location will not only destroy the only open beautiful parcel of grass area we have in Terravita, it will remove the one haven we have that's used every single day by so many different members in so many different ways.

And, courts in this location will intrude on the lives of hundreds of Terravita members who never had the opportunity to vote on the proposal.

The destruction of this precious piece of property becomes even more tragic by then squeezing 2 pickleball courts into that small area ... creating more congestion and noise ... all while knowing that 2 courts can't possibly adequately service a community of more than 1380 homes.

In addition to destroying the natural beauty of the grass park, the courts will intrude on the lives of all members who play tennis and those who routinely enjoy leisurely relaxing at the Terravita pool and enjoying the serenity it provides.

Dear Mr Sharrard:

Having dealt with industrial noise abatement projects throughout my prior career, I offer the following concerns to the impact of the location of proposed Pickleball courts to the quality of life across the Terravita community.

The Ad Hoc Committee presentation covered the consultants' decibel data at different distances along with options to mitigate using noise abatement materials. Meeting the Scottsdale daytime/nighttime noise ordinances is not the real issue, because ordinance noise measurements are typically measured or accumulated averages over times which are much longer than the time it takes a hard paddle to hit a hard ball. In my opinion, the problem will be that the most complained about noise WILL be when the paddle hits the ball, and it will likely ALWAYS be audible, regardless of noise abatement strategies.

The excerpt below is from a consultant's report from a similar study conducted in California. In fact, some of the slides used in our presentation were the same as presented in our meeting

"Noise control is recommended to reduce the pickleball noise at the nearby noise-sensitive receptors. With the implementation of noise control options, pickleball noise would be reduced. However, the impulsive character of the noise could remain audible and may still be a source of annoyance to sensitive individuals"

Reduced, not eliminated. In the end, as is typically the case for most noise issues, it boils down to individual sensitivities. That's why it is almost impossible to satisfy everyone. Once someone "hears" an intermittent noise like paddle to ball, they can't unhear it. For homeowners whose homes are within earshot (I am not one) when they are outside on their patios or trying to sleep with windows open, they will likely be bothered. As for the pool, if pickleball noise is audible, it will definitely lower the quality of the poolside experience.

Is the 200 ft distance from homes enough? No one can really answer, not even consultants. It depends on too many ambient conditions. Abatement can be implemented according to plan correctly, but a sensitive ear might still pick up the impact noise under the right conditions. That is what TCC has to prepare for if Pickleball moves ahead. Can certain property values be affected? Will people move because of Pickleball? Will affected residents sue Terravita?

Some of the same arguments can be raised about tennis, albeit a much "softer" noise, tennis is here – and always has been, so no need to litigate it. Adding a new and unnatural Pickleball noise in the proposed area will be an overall negative noise experience with the aforementioned risks, whereas tennis is not.

When resultant noise issues were raised during the Pickleball Committee meeting, the committee dismissed concerns out of hand that noise was already "addressed" by the consultants. In other words, the committee did their due diligence - hired the consultants - as if somehow that invalidated the concerns of stakeholders. While Terravita is a large and diverse community with different wants and needs and governed by their own covenants, there have never been forced projects that harmed a majority for the benefit of a few. That alone is an undesirable precedent to set. It is only by a stipulation in the covenants that the Pickleball issue was not put to a community majority vote and was left to a few committee members whose motives cannot be known.

Finally, 6 new pickleball courts are slated for the new Summit park behind the Safeway Plaza. While their proximity and availability would not be as convenient for Terravita's pickleball players, it's not a given that the benefit of convenience for the relatively few Terravita players is worth the additional noise nuisance created on the majority of community members who either don't play pickleball or do enjoy the serenity of our pool complex, which is one of the best in the area.

If the Design Review Board has any jurisdictional scope and input into Terravita's Pickleball conflict, we would appreciate any assistance you may render. The proposed location of the courts is a non-starter for the majority of the residents here. If there aren't any other suitable locations within the community, perhaps Pickleball was never meant to be an amenity that Terravita can reasonably offer without creating targeted hardships for some homeowners and non-Pickleball players.

Mr. Sharrard,

My wife Melanie and I are long time residents of Terravita. We purchased a lot in a prime location near the tennis courts, club house, and pool in March of 1996. Construction was completed on our house in August of the same year. We have occupied the house 6 months per year ever since.

We spend a good deal of time in the late afternoon and evenings enjoying our backyard and patio which faces the tennis courts and proposed pickle ball courts. Up to this point evenings have been largely peaceful and quiet.

Pickle ball is a disturbingly loud game due to rapid

harsh paddle sounds and boisterous excited participant and spectator cheering.

When Terravita was developed by Del Webb in the early 1990's pickle ball had not yet become popular and no provision for courts was made which would be away from homes as is now done. Since 2009 however, pickle ball enthusiasts at terravita have made multiple requests to multiple boards of directors to have pickle ball courts constructed.

The issue has been studied exhaustively with each board coming to the same conclusion - there is no good place to play pickle ball here without disturbing residents. In 2014 two pickle ball courts were set up on tennis court #5 which is approximately 50 yards away from our back yard.

The noise was intolerable both inside the house and in the yard. We invited the board over to listen. They agreed, there should be no pickle ball on the tennis courts. In July 2016 the TCC board voted not to build new pickle ball courts, and disbanded the committee looking for alternative locations.

In 2020/2021 a new board formed a new ad hoc committee and tasked it with finding the best location for two pickle ball courts. A finding of no suitable site was not an option. They came up with the site for which terravita Country Club is seeking a permit to build two pickle ball courts. It is on a grassy area between the swimming pool and tennis courts. They propose to enclose it in sound reducing material and have moved it farther from homes on Amber Sun Drive. Sound reduction to

an acceptable level has not been tested, however. Further, if the game is as popular as proponents say, they will be back in future years demanding expansion with corresponding increase in noise and disturbance to the neighborhood.

Those of us who reside in the neighborhood nearest the future pickle ball courts remain skeptical that noise levels will be acceptable and property values will be maintained. We in the neighborhood are not against pickle ball, but at Terravita there is no place for courts which will not intrude upon the residents peace, quiet, and tranquility. We therefore support our neighbors against issuance of a permit.

My husband and I have been Terravita residents for the past 15 years. Terravita was our second home up until 3 years ago.

The things that attracted us to Terravita 15 years ago were the facilities and beauty. Terravita was designed to blend in with the Arizona desert. There are no bright lights, all the houses are painted in desert brown colors. The development was laid out to take advantage of the spectacular views of Black Mountain, sunsets, and beautiful golf course expanses.

There is a small grass area between the pool and the tennis courts. You can see people doing Yoga there or just gathering with friends. It is the perfect buffer between the pool and the tennis courts. I have to believe this area was designed for that purpose. I don't believe it was meant to be used for "expansion" of sports facilities.

My husband and I both believe Terravita should have pickleball courts. There are many homeowners here who play the sport. Also, having pickleball courts keep Terravita competitive with newer housing developments.

The proposal to install pickleball courts in that grassy area is extremely upsetting on a number of levels.

That area was designed to be a quiet, scenic spot between the pool and the tennis courts. If pickleball courts go in that area, the noise to those of us using the pool and even the tennis players will be awful. Pickleball is a noisy sport. The sound produced by the impact of the hard paddle and ball creates a sharp pop. Some even describe the noise like "gunshots".

This is to say nothing of what the homeowners on Amber Sun will endure. These people bought their homes knowing there were tennis courts, not pickleball courts. There's an enormous difference.

Dear Mr. Sharrard and Members of the Design Review Committee for the City of Scottsdale:

I am a resident of Amber Sun and will be impacted by the noise of pickleball if the courts are built in the proposed location in Terravita and are built without proper sound mitigation. I believe that residents who are in close proximity to the proposed courts have a "grandfathered" right to a level of peace and tranquility in their homes and yards that will be upset if these courts are allowed to be built without proper sound barriers. Further, our homes will devalue if the sound barriers are insufficient. Many on City of Scottsdale design review committee are aware that the game of pickleball – while enormously popular – is a sport that sounds like ping pong on steroids. Add to that the more raucous nature of the pickleball culture and we have a recipe for extreme disruption for the nearby residents, as well as for people trying to enjoy peace and solitude at the pool and on the tennis courts.

When Terravita was developed in the mid 1990's, pickleball was scarcely known. Fast forward to today and many Terravita residents believe that the placement of these proposed courts is poorly thought out. That, in fact, the current design of Terravita's resort-like recreation complex will be ruined if the courts are placed in the area proposed. The proposed area is a grassy section between the tennis courts and the oversized pool / lounge area that is affectionately known as "Central Park" by the hundreds of residents and family members who enjoy it regularly. The grass acts as a lovely, aesthetic buffer that surrounds development – much like the original Central Park in New York City.

My understanding is that City of Scottsdale does not reject proposals outright. This body may ask the Terravita Country Club (TCC) to "go back to the drawing board." As such, I go back to the argument that effective -- albeit hideous looking -- sound mitigation must be adhered to by the TCC when developing PB courts on our park.

What follows is a cut and paste from a sound engineering study that was conducted exclusively for the pickleball court project in Terravita. I believe that the entire contents of the study have been made available to you. The condensed version below offers the most salient points, in my view.

AGI consultant Pickleball Noise analysis study- Terravita Country Club November 12, 2020

"pickleball noise levels will still be clearly discernable to the nearest homeowners on E Amber Sun Drive" pg 8

"With the 12 foot high acoustic fencing, the pickleball noise would be below the 50-55dBA guidelines for residential noise impact assessment. However, the pickleball noise levels would be approximately 6dB **higher than the ambient noise level** at around 35dBA level **and audible to the nearest residents**." pg 13

Consultant summary

"Alternatively, the analysis has determined that a **12 foot high acoustical fencing (full surround)** would provide a clearly noticeable noise reduction compared to no noise barrier case. Requiring Pickleball players to use quiet paddles and rotation of the court by 90 degrees would further reduce noise levels. Because Terra Vita community to located in a quiet ambient environment, noise from **the pickleball play will not be reduced to an inaudible level by constructing a noise barrier and additional noise control measures.**

Homeowners objections to Terravita Country Club design submission in Parcel G

- 1. Submitted design does not follow Consultant recommendation for a 12 foot full acoustic fence surround nor a full 90 degree rotation.
- 2. Consultant study confirms that with all sound mitigation steps pickleball play "will not be reduced to an inaudible level" thus impacting home owners backyard enjoyment and home values
- 3. Sound study does not include players in game and audience noise of continuous play during the day and weekends
- 4. NO equivalent Terravita Country Club study that measures noise or required noise mitigation steps for those using our Community pool at just 40 feet (5 times closer than nearest home in noise study) from the proposed Pickleball & Bocce ball courts and players/audience waiting area

In conclusion I want to thank you for your time and care in taking this (small in comparison) project and giving proper weight to the rights of Terravita residents – a right to a serene enjoyment of their homes and yards.

Dr. Gushari . . . and other Design Review Board members: I would like to first say, how much I appreciated the time you took and the questions you asked during the July 15th Hearing which I zoomed. I could tell that each of you had read the letters submitted by the homeowners that were not in favor of the pickleball courts and expressed concerns over sound. Your questions were direct, relevant and thoughtful.

On July 26th, the Board of Directors held a Zoom meeting which included Pickleball Report on the Agenda. An e-mail went to the Residents regarding this meeting and how to zoom attendance. You were given the alternative of e-mailing your questions prior to the meeting to the Troon Management or typing them in during the Zoom meeting. I typed my questions (9 of them) and emailed to Troon. When the meeting came time to ask and answer questions, I noticed that NONE of mine were being read. When I typed in were my questions going to be read and addressed, I was told "we emailed you this afternoon". When I read the email later that evening, I was basically told that my questions were already answered on the Terravita Website. Seriously? My intent was to engage the Committee in discussion, as well as, all of the Residents listening.

Here are a few things that you need to know:

I live on a cul-de-sac with 7 other homes. We all have backyards that face the pickleball area with a wash and road in between. I WAS THE ONLY HOMEOWNER WITHIN 750' THAT RECEIVED WRITTEN NOTIFICATION. NONE OF MY NEIGHBORS RECEIVED ANYTHING. I spoke with each of my neighbors regarding this notification. I know they fall within the 750' due to our small lot sizes and closeness of the homes.

At the July 26th Committee meeting a homeowner asked if any of the 60 homeowners against Pickleball had been contacted since the Hearing regarding their concerns. Answer: NO.

None of the Recommendations from the City Board were even addressed at this meeting.

There are approximately 1,400 homes in Terravita. Per the Board 150 were for pickleball and 60 were against. The homeowners in Terravita WERE NEVER surveyed as to whether they wanted pickleball. What about the other 1,100 homeowners? Since Terravita is a snowbird subdivision, how many of the 150 are full-time residents? How many are part-time residents? Having managed HOA's, I would have expected at least a 40% response (positive or negative) before moving forward and/or modifying the subdivision.

Page 2, continued.

As a lap swimmer, I know that the noise level will travel up and over to the nearby pool. This is a reality (due to the proximity of the courts) that they do not care about. The lap pool was 90% of the reason we bought in Terravita. Their proposed sound modifications are irrelevant for this amenity.

They state that the court will only be open for play "9-5, with special equipment". Really? Who is going to monitor this? Management? They don't manage the Swimming Pool area for people using it without Guest Passes, kids under 6 going in the jacuzzi and kids screaming and playing ball games in the Lap Lanes. I lived here for 5 years, and only in 2018 did Management monitor the pool. Note: this was before Troon took over management.

Pickleball is always about the sound! Every developer in the United States knows this. Typically, due to this issue, courts are designed and installed in appropriate areas away from the homes being built.

I am not against Pickleball . . . only against it being built in Terravita.

Public Courts are available in the area! Public Courts will be built on Asher Hills which everyone can ride their bike to.

I appreciate your time and look forward to your efforts in asking the "tough" questions moving forward.

I attempted to send the below info via Development Review Board's agenda page. It took several attempts to get site to accept the code necessary to submit. So I am not sure whether or not it ever worked. Below is copy of what I tried to send earlier.

42-DR-1993#3 (Terravita Pickleball and Bocce Courts)

The City of Scottsdale Development Board should not approve this project. The fact is there is not adequate buildable space available in Terravita to build pickle ball courts. This concept was thoroughly studied by the Country Club Board before and rejected. (Bocce ball courts?? I have no idea where that idea came from. Not widely publicized, and not sure Bocce ball courts are consistently shown in project materials.) The many problems include legal, drainage, environmental, and aesthetics issues.

Paving over this much land in this tiny, cramped space will change the aesthetics forever, and will further raise the temperature in what used to be a tiny oasis. There are three, very large, mature saguaros next to the walkway pylons. They are too large to be good candidates for relocation.

- A. Questions COS Development Board should consider include:
- 1. Legal issues: who owns property that abuts the proposed project to the south.
- 2. Negative environmental impact on drainage and loss of mature plant materials. Compare to the historical aerial photos of 2000 2010, and you will see the trend of continued loss of tree cover and plants on Terravita Country Club land.
- 3. IF the project is even physically feasible to place court walls against the walkway pylons without disrupting foundations of the walkway pylons, the aesthetics will be ugly from the walkway. According to illustrations the walls of the courts look like they actually stick into that tiny space between pylons.
- B. Land ownership, drainage easements, and construction access.
- 1. The proposal is on a Terravita Country Club owned Parcel that includes drainage easements.
- 2. Per City of Scottsdale parcel information interactive map, Terravita Country Club does not own the Vista Corridor that directly abuts this proposed project parcel. Note that Vista Corridor extends into the Country Club parcel. (And, in fact, not long ago the Terravita Community Association was asked and paid to maintain drainage on the Country Club Parcel.
- 3. Paving over scarce land will negatively affect the Vista Corridor with increased runoff. Gone would be many trees, plants and the only public turf area in all of Terravita's over 800 acres.
- 4. The Vista Corridor appears to be the only construction access, and it is not owned by Terravita Country Club. Great damage will occur to the banks of the Vista Corridor

if the Terravita Community Association (owner) were to give permission for construction access.

I am very concerned about all the going ons in relation to the addition of these courts.

First, the Real Estate Agents were talking that the Courts are a done deal way before the vote of the Board on having Courts. They said we know the Board will vote yes. This is what they were telling buyers. It appears the decision was already made up to vote yes.

Actually after 60 some emails of Terravita residents talking about concerns of noise, now over the 750' including many more houses, 3 of the 7 Board Members voted NO.

The Terravita Country Club Board has said they conducted a Survey. Many More than Several of the homeowners have never received AnY survey about the Pickle Ball Courts.

The only recent survey was one done to all Terravita residents as an email survey from the HOA about facing homes with stones or rocks, asking if one was in favor or not. Many residents answered NO and that was the end of that. This shows it is not impossible to notify affected ALL members in possible actions of a Board even though it was only a cost to each member desiring rock fronted homes. And these Pickle Ball Courts are now an estimated cost close to \$300,000.and NO SURVEY of Terravita home owners. Not one.

We were told there would be a grassy area added in back of the Desert Pavilion with the bocce ball courts. That information is changed to bocce ball courts on the grassy area known as the croquet court. The croquet players were never asked if they minded there would be no more croquet on the grassy area by the pool. I like croquet. And there is no use of this area behind the Desert Pavilion planned at all.

What will be the rules for use of these courts...and Who will enforce the rules.?

There are residents who are not good about speeding, walking in the streets, blocking sidewalk traffic and not picking up after their dogs messes. Will they follow rules?

Some Members are shaming others by saying you are not being a good member by not giving up at least one tennis court to the Pickle Ball players. I play tennis. What will happen if these Pickle Ball players do not get their grassy area replaced by their 2 Courts? Oh, and are 2 Courts enough? Where will they expand but the Tennis courts.? Are there 150 or 300 players as we are told. That is a lot of players on two courts.

However, I wonder what will happen to the ONE and ONLY POOL with noise. It is strongly controlled about noise now with no boom boxes, cell phones or loud conversations. It a place of peace and quiet.

There are home values that will be affected by this noise in their back/front yards and all residents by the noise at their POOL and the only grassy area that is available to members in a desert land place.

I say find another location. But, the TCC Board did not care to Implement any of the goo recommended suggestions by your Board at their recent Board meeting . There is an attitude of we are the BOARD and we do not have to listen to anyone......it's our decision and our vote. I thought Boards are to represent the entire membership of the Terravita Community.

I am concerned about Respect of the Pickle Ball Committee and now the Terravita Country Club Board for the residents , the home owners , by not notifying these Members about the desire for courts and the locations. I believe a Survey of the Entire Membership should have taken place.

When I suggested this several times in phone call and letters I was told the Board has all the power to make decisions and do not have to inform the membership. I disagreed and continue to disagree.

Over 5 years ago there was trial use of some tennis courts for Pickle ball. There were some meetings of the Terravita Membership and voices were listened to. Use was past play times, courtesy was missing and use of loud voices including many swear words often. It was turned down and promises made to end this addition to Terravita activities, forever. Seems, promises mean absolutely nothing. Words are worthless.

These are examples of following rules every where at this time with some of Terravita residents; for example dog walkers have the responsibility to pick up after their dogs and they are not very good at this. There is pool noise control now.....no boom boxes, no cell phones and no loud conversations. In the past though there has NOT been good supervision of the swimming pool....so how are the planned courts going to be supervised? What are the rules? Will this group of players honor the use rules.?

Oh, yes. There is a dark sky concept in Terravita with lights at the homes and in the streets. How did the tennis Courts get lights? Two Courts ..3/4 are lighted and ...stay on times past the City of Scottsdale rules of 10:00. My house overlooks these courts and I have added an

Awning to block the light that I had to get permission from the HOA. The large Mesquite Tree also blocked the lights but it was just uprooted in the storm July 17. And is now in pieces removed. Will the Pickle Ball courts have lights? Of course if tennis has it, then they should as well. That will be the demand.

Now, the next item of thoughtlessness is the grassy park...now, .also called the Croquet

Court allowed use by any and all members of Terravita. Dogs visit, neighbors meet, friends become friends. There is only ONE GRASS area here. This is a valuable piece of nature in a desert community of desert trees, desert shrubs, and desert cactus. No grass lawns one can visit are here...but there is a golf course but no one is allowed on the golf cart path before 7 or after 7 like some other clubs. I am writing as a homeowner and resident of the Terravita Golf and Country Club at 34034 N. 69th Way in North Scottsdale.

Please Approve Requested Use:

Del Webb, in selecting our beautiful north Scottsdale location, couldn't have contemplated pickleball as an emerging sport. But what Del Webb did in the early 1990's is give us an ideal spot of land today to add to the existing amenities. By approving this land use request, you will resolve a long sought-after solution for new courts to be built and ensure that Terravita remains one of the premiere communities in North Scottsdale.

History of the Land Use Issue:

I served on a Joint Long Range Planning Committee from 2010-2012 where the idea of pickleball and bocce were first introduced to the Terravita community as "new trends" in amenities in similar communities around the country. I then was elected and served as a member of the Terravita Country Club Board from 2013 to 2017 when a concerted effort was made to add Pickleball as an amenity in Terravita, including searching for and contemplating placement of new courts within the Terravita campus.

Following the introduction of the idea of pickleball in the long-range planning focus groups and survey, a group of already active pickleball players approached the Terravita Country Club Board in 2013 to seek approval to play pickleball on the existing tennis courts. The Board voted to allow a trial on one of the courts. The court wasn't ideal but as a multi-use court (basketball), worked to introduce the game and draw a new and supportive group of players. This trial was short in part due to the restrictive walls around this particular court which were not conducive to safe play.

In 2014 the Board then moved the growing sport for a trial onto our larger "tournament" tennis court. This trial raised the ire of the existing tennis players because it meant having to add and remove the lines for pickleball so that the tennis players could retain their beautiful court "unblemished" for regular and tournament play. Again, not ideal but an honest attempt to balance the desires of two active groups – tennis and pickleball. As I remember, this trial was stopped by the Board after a few months of play

In 2015, a new trial was started on Court #5 which your records will show, has close proximity to the homes on Amber Sun Drive. At the end of the trial in the spring of 2016, the Board agreed with the nearby neighbors that, at that time, the noise was intrusive and stopped the trial on that court due to the close proximity to the homes and an unwillingness by the Board to explore retrofitting the existing courts with the then-heavy sound barrier blankets.

It is important to note that during all of these trials, the Club hired consultants, paid for studies on noise barrier systems, reviewed and authorized noise-reducing equipment, etc. etc. All in all, a good effort to try to find a balance between resident concerns and the resident interest in playing pickleball in Terravita. In the end, the play was stopped until a solution could be found for new courts.

Character and Design of Request:

Of great note is that the proposal before you, located within the sports complex of Terravita, is on land being used for similar purposes. Six tennis courts, a pool, and the gym, all contained in the same area giving the proposed additional courts access to restrooms, water stations, and key in the area – existing parking. The grassy area that is the subject of your review is being moved so the community will not lose access to this small bit of grass and, in fact, will find it in a better location with shade, seating, and access to our Desert Pavilion building.

I am writing to ask that the Planning Review Board approve the request before you. In keeping with the character and design of our 27-year old community, along with the new technologies developed for sound abatement, equipment changes to reduce the noise of the game, and the ideal placement further away from the homes on Amber Sun Drive, this is the best and only solution for the use of this land since we first considered the idea of pickleball in 2013.

Approval of the use of this land for new pickleball and bocce courts is the perfect end to a very long community effort of review and prior attempts to add these new amenities. Please approve request #42-D-1993#3 at your meeting on July 15, 2021.

According to illustrations the walls of the courts look like they actually stick into that tiny space between pylons. B. Land ownership, drainage easements, and construction access. 1. The proposal is on a Terravita Country Club owned Parcel that includes drainage easements. 2. Per City of Scottsdale parcel information interactive map, Terravita Country Club does not own the Vista Corridor that directly abuts this proposed project parcel. Note that Vista Corridor extends into the Country Club parcel. (And, in fact, not long ago the Terravita Community Association was asked and paid to maintain drainage on the Country Club Parcel. 3. There are over 8 years of history related to several attempts by proponent to force pickleball courts onto a location deemed unsuitable to that activity. In 2013, the TCC Board of Directors experimented with allowing pickleball to be played on tennis courts. My husband and I are current homeowners and for years we owned a rental home located at 6871 E Amber Sun Drive, just behind the experimental tennis court that was used for the pickleball test. After some time my tenants reluctantly

complained that they could not use the patio when pickleball was in play and it was also an irritant when indoors. Adjacent neighbors finally invited the TCC Board President to sit in their yard during a pickleball tournament. Following the visit the president described the noise discomfort from the constant "twang" of the pickleball as intolerable. Subsequently other interested Directors agreed. These homes are in close proximity to the location now under review, the grassy area by tennis and the pool. During that 2013 pickleball trial the TCC Board finally hired audio specialists to perform sound studies in search of a solution. The results indicated that the pickleball sport exceeded acceptable sound levels in the areas around the tennis courts and nearby homes. Today that would include the grassy area being examined in this letter. More than one sound study was done over the years. Information from one study indicated that pickleball sound can travel as far as 300 to 500 feet. It was also discussed that proponents will focus on the decibel levels while ignoring the frequency pitch when discussing noise pollution. It is the frequency pitch along with the repetition that creates the painful ear syndrome. Other sound studies at that time showed that using improved paddleball s and equipment reduced some noise, but not sufficiently. As the tennis courts and the pool area surround the grassy area selected for the pickleball courts and also as homes are very close, all three areas would be impacted by excessive noise pollution. In addition, most residents do not realize that there is added noise created by cheering spectators as is part of this sport, and not approved by tennis players. Most homeowners would happily agree to have pickleball in Terravita should there be a location available that would not impact any homeowners or community activities as a result of noise problems. In the early years of the experiments a Realtor commented that the location in use would decrease our property values and that was an additional concern for Amber Sun Drive homeowners. As this matter has

been fought over so many years, It is my hope that Scottsdale help us put an end to this multi-year experiment and allow us to move on to important community issues. Approximately 10 pickleball courts will soon be located within 2 to 3 miles of our Terravita community entry gate; that is barely farther than some Terravita homes to the tennis courts. It is my understanding that your Development Review Board members are very thorough in making decisions of this type and have shown that in the recent hearing held on July 15th. I appreciate your hard work and thank you for the time you have taken and will take in the future to close this matter, hopefully for the last time. Marlene Hokuf

Sound control "IS" part of the design and requires quantifiable rationale for each step defined, based on best known "standards of measurement "specific to pickleball." So, we formally ask the Development Review Board to: 1) Direct Terravita to have an 'independent' second sound study (agreed to by TCC and affected homeowners) completed for the proposed location. The new sound study should include multiple points around the pool, tennis courts and the homes within 750 feet ... a full 360 degree map that considers both pickleball play AND players. 2) An agreed upon written plan for what technical noise mitigations will be required and what equipment is mandated for play 3) An agreed upon written plan for days and hours of play, rules for players waiting to play ... and how all rules will be enforced 4) An agreed upon postconstruction sound study to be conducted on actual noise during play, with both pickleball courts and both bocce ball courts in use at the same time. This study will then be compared to the original study projections for any necessary corrective actions. On August 19, we ask you to have Terravita respect the DRB recommendations to work with the homeowners on all of the above points ... and then come back to the DRB with a iointly-agreed upon solution. Pickleball Courts at Terravita I understand that Terravita has requested approval for construction of 2 pickleball courts on the grass area between the swimming pool and the tennis courts. While I strongly support the construction of pickleball courts at Terravita, this proposal requests that they be constructed in what is probably the worst possible location. It will adversely affect the pool users due to noise and obstructed views, and is close to residences, and is an aesthetically pleasing green area. Additionally Terravita is sure to need 4 to 6 pickleball courts, so additional courts would need to constructed elsewhere eventually. It is my understanding that the HOA has investigated other locations and is unable to find suitable alternative locations. It would seem to me to be much more sensible to construct the courts adjacent to Tennis Court 1, using the walkway area and a handful of parking bays in the adjacent pool/tennis parking lot. It is rumored (but not confirmed) that this would not be permissible due to extremely stringent City parking design and capacity requirements. Surely there must be a way around this? Perhaps by adding additional parking bays in one of the 3 surrounding

parking lots (none of which are ever more
than half full!). It's possible that this may

Re: Terravita request for pickleball/bocce courts As full-time residents whose family uses the Terravita pool regularly, we appreciate the quiet space, tranquility of the pool atmosphere and the views of Black Mountain that we currently enjoy from the pool. My husband swims laps at the pool as we don't have our own pool. The enjoyment of the pool was one of our top reasons for moving back to Terravita. We are not opposed to pickleball/bocce having a future place in Terravita but the proposed location shows lack of planning and foresight. It impedes the enjoyment of the pool and the grassy area currently used for other residents. The noise factor along with the physical space constraints (only 2 courts - no room for growth) and the lack of restroom facilities (the current pool house only has 2 toilets per M/F hasn't even been raised). If the TCC is serious about wanting pickleball/bocce or Multi-sport area, I would prefer they make a long term commitment for a solution. Respect needs to be given to a solution that doesn't negatively affect current homeowners property values or enjoyment - not only the 11 homes directly affected by the current proposal but the other 1280+ homes in the development

that haven't been considered in the current scenario. The original budget was for \$252k, raised by \$20-25k, and suddenly shown in the most recent July board meeting at \$375k. As this is what I consider to be a significant expenditure with lasting impact, full community support would make it worthwhile and should be required before development of a pickleball/bocce or multi-sport facility. Thank you for your consideration to our concerns.

This letter is in reference to the Development Review Board hearing for Pickleball in Terravita Country Club which will take place on August 19th. Reference number is 42-DR-2021 I am writing this letter in regard to the second application hearing for Pickle Ball Courts by Terravita Country Club(TCC) which will be coming up to Development and Review Board (DRB) on August 19. Following the first application hearing on July 15, there was a Terravita Country Club (TCC) Board meeting to discuss the results of the hearing with the DRB. The DRB did their homework and asked pertinent questions and offered helpful suggestions. Needless to say, TCC is not addressing the concerns of the DRB. The TCCBoard stated they will "not" reach out to our affected homeowners to reconcile concerns and will "not "do any additional sound study work. Also, TCC does not, and will not, have any sound measurements for the Terravita pool area. They are continuing to follow their original plan, squeezing 2 Pickle Ball and 2 Bocce Ball on a small grassy area that was intended to be a croquet court with inadequate sound mitigation as defined in the next paragraph. As background

information, the TCC Board approved the Acoustics Group Incorporated (AGI) to conduct a study in 2015. This study did not include measurement of impulse noise. The Board approved recommendations from this study that had been arbitrarily altered by the Pickle Ball Committee. This study also omitted the sound impact on the pool area The TCC Board approved a 10-foot fence instead of a 12-foot fence recommended by AGI. The Board also approved only two sides will be covered with acoustical blankets instead of being completely surrounded as recommended by AGI. By approving arbitrarily altered recommendations from this professional sound study, this negates the mitigation affects. Our community has over 200+ members who will want to use these courts. To meet the needs of these players you will need a minimum of 6 courts. In conclusion, the motion that was passed at the DRB hearing on July 15th stated that the TCC does not have specific guidelines on how to mitigate noise for the neighbors and pool and it was incomplete. Also, to have this approved, proper information is needed. I trust that the City of Scottsdale will hold TCC to task and abide in this motion and mandate that the TCC does their homework and submits the specific sound mitigation guidelines. It is essential that neighbors and pool users will be assured that proper sound mitigation will be implemented to protect them from nuisance noise and homeowners' property will not be devalued. This location is totally inadequate to meet the needs of the community. A second sound study including impulse measurements should be conducted using a third-party professional company before and after construction. A meeting to reconcile with affected neighbors should be scheduled. If proper data is not submitted, this project should not be approved

Terravita Pickleball and Bocce Courts Request for approval to add two (2) pickleball courts and two (2) bocce courts to replace an existing croquet lawn. 42-DR-1993#3 This is an addendum to my submission yesterday. I want the DRB to be aware of fact that The TCC Board approved their appointed Pickle Ball Ad Hoc's findings that incorporated vastly altered recommendations from the third-party professional sound study group, The Acoutics Group Incorporated. Note the altered recommendations or lack there of in parenthesis. Here are AGI's 5 recommendations in black ink and the Ad Hoc Committee's altered recommendations in red ink.(page 19) The following recommendations are identified to provide a substantial reduction of the pickleball noise at the nearest residences. 1. A 12-foot-high noise barrier (barrier height is relative to the court elevation) should be constructed along the western and northern boundary of the pickleball courts as shown in Figure 4, to reduce the pickleball noise at Receptors 1 and 6. Materials such as concrete block, plexiglass, or acoustical blanket (e.g., Acoustical Solutions Noise S.T.O.P. Soundproof Blanket STC 33, NRC 0.75) should be used to provide the sound transmission needed. (This option was not approved by the Ad Hoc Committee). 2. As an alternative, a 12-ft high acoustical fencing (acoustical fencing height is relative to the court elevation) can be constructed surrounding the proposed pickleball court location as shown in Figure 5. Acoustiblok, AcoustiFence or acoustical equivalent should provide a minimum STC 28 rating or greater (The Ad Hoc committee arbitrarily recommended reducing the height of the fence from 12 feet to 10 feet. The committee also arbitrarily recommended that only 1-2 sides of the surrounding fence would be covered with acoustic blankets instead of AIG's recommendation that all sides be completely surrounded.) 3. Require Pickleball players to use the newest "quietest" or "Quieter" paddles. Require an inspection of the paddles and ball prior to being of play. (There was no mention as to how this inspection was going to be monitored prior to the beginning of play.) 4. Rotate the design of the Pickleball Courts by 90 degrees, so tht the baselines are perpendicular to the residences to the North. (This recommendation was not approved by the Ad Hoc Committee. Instead, the courts are oriented in a north and south direction with the baselines facing north, directly toward the tennis courts and homes on Amber Sun which are 200- 400 feet away from the courts. This orientation will direct the sound towards the homes. The north baseline side toward the homes will not be covered with acoustic blankets as

recommended by AGI.) 5. Consider limiting the days and hours of pickleball play to time periods that are less intrusive to nearby homeowners. (There were no data shared as to how the hours of play were going to be monitored i.e. if there is play before 8 a.m. after 5 p.m. who will monitor the prohibited of hours of play and how will it be prevented.) In summary the five recommendations put forth by AGI based on scientific evidence were either not considered or completely altered by the Ad Hoc committee. 1. The Ad Hoc did not consider Option 1. 2. The Committee altered vital recommendations to mitigate sound in option 2 and 4. 3. The Ad Hoc committee did not present data as far as implementation of option 3 and 5. The TCC Board approved their recommendations. As a result of the Ad Hoc Committee arbitrarily altering the recommendations submitted by AGI and not basing these changes on sound data, the annoying sound of pickle ball will not be satisfactorily mitigated. Altering the recommendations based on a scientific study negates the AGI study altogether as these courts have now been designed at the whim of the Ad Hoc Committee and not based on this scientific study. Vital sound mitigation options/recommendations were not considered and or deleted/altered. This small green park was designed by Del Webb to be a quiet space. It is called a croquet court on their original design. It was not designed to cram two noisy pickleball courts and two Bocce Ball Courts between two quiet amenities, the pool and tennis courts, and within 210 feet of the back yards of the beautiful homes on Amber Sun Drive. And now that the recommended sound mitigation has been not recommended/altered by the Ad Hoc Committee, it will be a travesty to go forth with this plan. Pickleball would be an appropriate, popular amenity in Terravita but not at this location. My name is Deborah Lewis. I have been a Terravita resident living on Amber Sun Drive for over three years. My home is located well within 750 feet of the proposed pickleball location cited in the Terravita application. After reviewing the video of the Development Review Board's July 15 hearing, it became clear the City of Scottsdale may not be fully aware of Terravita's organizational structure, and just how Terravita Country (TCC) is chartered to govern within Terravita. Please note that the TCC applicant is a separate legal entity for country club management only. It is not the HOA for Terravita residents. TCC governs only 23 acres of property within Terravita. The 23 acres that TCC owns includes the parking lots and land around the club house, the Desert Pavilion (community center), the swimming pool, the tennis courts and the grassy park area between the pool and tennis courts. Most of us objecting to Terravita's plan submission are doing so as Scottsdale property owners sharing property lines to the Club complex. We are not objecting as members of Terravita. Thus, we neighboring property owners call upon the DRB to reinforce that the applicant cannot force any homeowners,

living outside of TCC's 23 acres, to accept a newly created noise nuisance with their independently defined, arbitrary "acceptable" noise level -- levels that even their own sound consultant study says will be above current ambient sound levels. And, as the Board noted in the July 15 hearing, that study itself is flawed, incomplete and inadequate for the area specific to pickle ball noise. My neighbors and I support the July 15 DRB comments and suggestions that the applicant work with neighboring homeowners for a joint set of terms and conditions on acceptable sound abatement design specifications through an updated sound study prior to any further DRB action. Finally, I want to let you know that my neighbors and I are so very grateful for your time and effort. To: Scottsdale Development Review Board Date: 4 August 2021 My name is Carl Kueltzo. I am a full time, twenty year, resident of Terravita. As a retired Urban Planner and current member of the American Planning Association, I am familiar with the parameters within which you must work in reaching your recommendations. And, as a body familiar with the design concepts embodied in modern "Planned Communities" such as Terravita, any major changes, as Picklball is in Terravita, I would hope, be reviewed comprehensively, as a major, general plan amendment. While municipal ordinances and regulations often make decision making easier, equally important, but less clearly defined, is the question of what is in "the best interest of the community, will the project enhance the broader community?" I will tell you from first hand experience as a resident, the attempts to "shoehorn" Pickleball onto the site proposed has been the most persistent and contentious issue dividing Terravita since I have lived here. Homeowners have left Terravita due to Pickleball "trial" noise and the prospect of it coming to Terravita. They simply could not enjoy the time on their patios. Additionally, the tranquility of our many pool users, less than twenty feet away from the site, will be lost. Also destroyed will be an integral design element of Del Webb's Master Plan for Terravita; the Community Green. Even admitting the visual ugliness of the proposal, it continues to be pushed forward. Incomprehensible and indefensible. Dr. Gushari . . . and other Design Review Board members: I would like to first say, how much I appreciated the time you took and the questions you asked during the July 15th Hearing which I zoomed. I could tell that each of you had read the letters submitted by the homeowners that were not in favor of the pickleball courts and expressed concerns over sound. Your questions were direct, relevant and thoughtful.

On July 26th, the Board of Directors held a Zoom meeting which included Pickleball Report on the Agenda. An e-mail went to the Residents regarding this meeting and how to zoom attendance. You were given the alternative of e-mailing your questions prior to the meeting to the Troon Management or typing them in during the Zoom meeting. I typed my questions (9 of them) and emailed to Troon. When the meeting came time to ask and answer questions, I noticed that NONE of mine were being read. When I typed in were my questions going to be read and addressed, I was told "we emailed you this afternoon". When I read the email later that evening, I was basically told that my questions were already answered on the Terravita Website. Seriously? My intent was to engage the Committee in discussion, as well as, all of the Residents listening.

Here are a few things that you need to know:

I live on a cul-de-sac with 7 other homes. We all have backyards that face the pickleball area with a wash and road in between. I WAS THE ONLY HOMEOWNER WITHIN 750' THAT RECEIVED WRITTEN NOTIFICATION. NONE OF MY NEIGHBORS RECEIVED ANYTHING. I spoke with each of my neighbors regarding this notification. I know they fall within the 750' due to our small lot sizes and closeness of the homes.

At the July 26th Committee meeting a homeowner asked if any of the 60 homeowners against Pickleball had been contacted since the Hearing regarding their concerns. Answer: NO.

None of the Recommendations from the City Board were even addressed at this meeting.

There are approximately 1,400 homes in Terravita. Per the Board 150 were for pickleball and 60 were against. The homeowners in Terravita WERE NEVER surveyed as to whether they wanted pickleball. What about the other 1,100 homeowners? Since Terravita is a snowbird subdivision, how many of the 150 are full-time residents? How many are part-time residents? Having managed HOA's, I would have expected at least a 40% response (positive or negative) before moving forward and/or modifying the subdivision.

As a lap swimmer, I know that the noise level will travel up and over to the nearby pool. This is a reality (due to the proximity of the courts) that they do not care about. The lap pool was 90% of the reason we bought in Terravita. Their proposed sound modifications are irrelevant for this amenity.

They state that the court will only be open for play "9-5, with special equipment". Really? Who is going to monitor this? Management? They don't manage the Swimming Pool area for people using it without Guest Passes, kids under 6 going in the jacuzzi and kids screaming and playing ball games in the Lap Lanes. I lived here for 5 years, and only in 2018 did Management monitor the pool. Note: this was before Troon took over management.

Pickleball is always about the sound! Every developer in the United States knows this. Typically, due to this issue, courts are designed and installed in appropriate areas away from the homes being built.

I am not against Pickleball . . . only against it being built in Terravita.

Public Courts are available in the area! Public Courts will be built on Asher Hills which everyone can ride their bike to.

I appreciate your time and look forward to your efforts in asking the "tough" questions moving forward.

42-DR-1993#3 (Terravita Pickleball and Bocce Courts)

The City of Scottsdale Development Board should not approve this project. The fact is there is not adequate buildable space available in Terravita to build pickle ball courts. This concept was thoroughly studied by the Country Club Board before and rejected. (Bocce ball courts?? I have no idea where that idea came from. Not widely publicized, and not sure Bocce ball courts are consistently shown in project materials.) The many problems include legal, drainage, environmental, and aesthetics issues.

Paving over this much land in this tiny, cramped space will change the aesthetics forever, and will further raise the temperature in what used to be a tiny oasis. There are three, very large, mature saguaros next to the walkway pylons. They are too large to be good candidates for relocation.

- A. Questions COS Development Board should consider include:
- 1. Legal issues: who owns property that abuts the proposed project to the south.
- 2. Negative environmental impact on drainage and loss of mature plant materials. Compare to the historical aerial photos of 2000 2010, and you will see the trend of continued loss of tree cover and plants on Terravita Country Club land.
- 3. IF the project is even physically feasible to place court walls against the walkway pylons without disrupting foundations of the walkway pylons, the aesthetics will be ugly from the walkway. According to illustrations the walls of the courts look like they actually stick into that tiny space between pylons.
- B. Land ownership, drainage easements, and construction access.
- 1. The proposal is on a Terravita Country Club owned Parcel that includes drainage easements.
- 2. Per City of Scottsdale parcel information interactive map, Terravita Country Club does not own the Vista Corridor that directly abuts this proposed project parcel. Note that Vista Corridor extends into the Country Club parcel. (And, in fact, not long ago the Terravita Community Association was asked and paid to maintain drainage on the Country Club Parcel.
- 3. Paving over scarce land will negatively affect the Vista Corridor with increased runoff. Gone would be many trees, plants and the only public turf area in all of Terravita's over 800 acres.
- 4. The Vista Corridor appears to be the only construction access, and it is not owned by Terravita Country Club. Great damage will occur to the banks of the Vista Corridor

if the Terravita Community Association (owner) were to give permission for construction access.

Actually after 60 some emails of Terravita residents talking about concerns of noise, now over the 750' including many more houses, 3 of the 7 Board Members voted NO.

The Terravita Country Club Board has said they conducted a Survey. Many More than Several of the homeowners have never received AnY survey about the Pickle Ball Courts.

The only recent survey was one done to all Terravita residents as an email survey from the HOA about facing homes with stones or rocks, asking if one was in favor or not. This shows it is not impossible to notify affected ALL members in possible actions of a Board even though it was only a cost to each member desiring rock fronted homes. That information is changed to bocce ball courts on the grassy area known as the croquet court. The croquet players were never asked if they minded there would be no more croquet on the grassy area by the pool. I like croquet. What will be the rules for use of these courts...and Who will enforce the rules.?

There is pool noise control now.....no boom boxes, no cell phones and no loud conversations. In the past though there has NOT been good supervision of the swimming pool....so how are the planned courts going to be supervised? What are the rules? Will this group of players honor the use rules.?

Oh, yes. There is a dark sky concept in Terravita with lights at the homes and in the streets. How did the tennis Courts get lights? Two Courts ..3/4 are lighted and ...stay on times past the City of Scottsdale rules of 10:00. My house overlooks these courts and I have added an

Awning to block the light that I had to get permission from the HOA. The large Mesquite Tree also blocked the lights but it was just uprooted in the storm July 17. And is now in pieces removed. Will the Pickle Ball courts have lights? Of course if tennis has it, then they should as well. That will be the demand.

Now, the next item of thoughtlessness is the grassy park...now, .also called the Croquet

Court allowed use by any and all members of Terravita. Dogs visit, neighbors meet, friends become friends. There is only ONE GRASS area here. This is a valuable piece of nature in a desert community of desert trees, desert shrubs, and desert cactus. No grass lawns one can visit are here...but there is a golf course but no one is allowed on the golf cart path before 7 or after 7 like some other clubs. It is a big No No No for non golfers to set a foot on the course. Were the local croquet players consulted. I play croquet but no more here. My back yard is like most...small....not room.and no grass either.

To put it together, Terravita residents purchase their homes for the beauty of the property. The large trees, the beautifully landscaped yards, the soft colors of the homes and the open spaces not built in where natural washes abound. Dear Scottsdale DRB Members,

I thought it might be useful to you and the DRB to know about an aside issue that is independent of the Pickleball project technicalities. I became aware of this issue after I attended the July 2021 Terravita BOD meeting which included a weak PB update - of sorts.

The BOD President's disingenuousness towards all matters and objections regarding PB lead me to believe that left unchallenged, PB will become the irritant that we are trying to avoid.

First of all, the BOD president claimed he could not hear anything at the City DRB meeting because of poor acoustics. That implies that all of the DRB's comments and feedback are about to go unheeded. No new sound survey, no updated study, and no complete outreach to affected homeowners, which were all recommended by the DRB. No new additions of concerned residents to the ad hoc committee either.

We have also learned that the previous homeowner outreach efforts were not effective, and that previous meetings about PB were selectively open to some affected homeowners and closed to others. This is not a Board that can be trusted on the PB issue. While that is our issue to be resolved during our next election, the DRB should be sensitized to the type of applicants they are dealing with.

I know enough about noise science to know that our President knows NOTHING about it. He is just a representative parroting content from standard cookbook slide presentations. If there are any other homeowner credentials on the PB committee aside from the consultants, they have not been identified. The consultants may or may not be qualified to measure or analyze the impulse type noise that PB generates, but they certainly have not addressed it in any meaningful or mitigative way.

There have been too many untrue statements issued by our BOD president without adequate rebuttal. The statements don't stand up to scrutiny. Maybe our President believes it all, but that doesn't make any of it true. If you think it would provide useful context, I can send you a copy of an email I sent to the Board President several months ago - and the woeful non-response I received from him. He is not representing all of us, and appears overly determined on driving this project through come hell or high water. We are asking the DRB to hold the BOD President's feet to the fire to prove that the necessary due diligence was performed by the PB committee and that all residents' concerns have been adequately addressed (they haven't so far).

The BOD's meetings are dial in Zoom meetings and the Board controls the agenda and the comments. They selectively address some questions about PB and reject others. This format fits their MO for PB - which is to ignore the realities. They are gaslighting the Terravita residents, and they will gaslight the DRB if given a chance.

Dear members of the Development Review Board,

Thank you for reading our letters and speaking to our concerns of noise impact to our homes at Terravita. Rather than a rubber stamp of approval, which the Terravita representatives were expecting, you asked for more thorough sound studies to be done and asked that the board reach out to homeowners to reconcile these concerns.

At the July 15th TCC meeting they stated they will not reach out to affected homeowners or do additional sound studies. Also, TCC will not do any sound measurements in the pool area which is just adjacent to these courts. They also stated it was "ok" with homeowners on Amber Sun which just isn't true.

As a property owner, well within 750' of these proposed courts I am sickened by the lack of caring and concern for any of us living near these courts. We have lived at Terravita for 25 years and the topic of Pickleball has come up four times. Three years ago it was tried on tennis courts 200' away from our home and with the windows closed we heard that persistent, penetrating noise from morning to dusk. Just remembering it puts a pit in my stomach. They also had time restrictions, 9-5:00 that were never complied with and at 6:30pm you could still hear them playing and partying. Finally, that board was invited to our home one afternoon during a pickleball gathering and they left saying that the noise was intolerable for people living near those courts and play was immediately discontinued.

Now we have a new board with many pickleball players not living anywhere near these courts, that have pushed to get a vote through during Covid restrictions. We kept writing and asking them to take more time, do more studies and try this new noise abatement blanket before they go digging up our only grassy area. Our noise consultant, with thirty years of experience, found many faults in their sound study as did Dr. Gushgart who made the motion for more studies to be done.

I believe the rush to take the vote during this restrictive time was purposeful so the homeowners, pool advocates, tennis players and our "central park" lovers could not be represented.

The vote was taken in a zoom meeting with only the board being allowed in the meeting. When it came to questions they said there were none until people started texting asking why their questions were not being addressed. They then read a

few and said those questions had already been answered and called for a vote. The vote was 4-3 in favor of the pickleball and bocce courts to be built.

We love our home at Terravita and paid a premium price for its location near the club house and all its amenities; pool, tennis courts, work out area and golf course. Never was Pickleball discussed or planned by Del Web. Now new members want to play pickleball at Terravita no matter what the cost to anyone else. Three years ago when I asked a realtor what kind of a hit we might expect on our property value should pickleball be approved near the proposed site. We were told as much as \$40,000 dollars. I can tell you we have had three new neighbors next door in the past year and half and our newest neighbor Buddy Sklar, a pickleball player, said he would never have bought had it been disclosed that pickleball would be so close to his home.

The Board says we must offer this amenity at Terravita to compete with other clubs but our real estate values have never been higher, homes do not stay on the market and buyers know all our current amenities.

As mentioned at your last hearing, 8 pickleball courts are planned for the city less than a mile from Terravita. This would be a perfect solution for our pickleball players.

Being Scottsdale residents, PLEASE protect our right to enjoy our homes and their value. Do not approve the Pickleball courts being built in the currently proposed location especially without more sound studies being done and plans for future courts being discussed.

We are newer full time residents to Terravita, just 3 years. It is my understanding that Terravita went through a similar request for pickleball several years ago and that it was turned down due to NOISE.

Just a little bit about me - sorry to bore you. I have played competitive tennis most of my life: Junior tournaments, High School, Division 1 and USTA. I love tennis BUT I am crazy about pickleball. It is a great work out, fun and very social. So when I heard about Terravita possibly getting a couple of pickleball courts I was excited to attend some committee meetings.

It was an eye opener. These committee members wanted pickleball no matter what and they didn't care that the NOISE would impact the quality of life for their neighbors and fellow Terravita members. I found their Noise Report suspect in the way it was presented. I was very disappointed.

Their arguments in favor of pickleball included

- "it will increase the value of their property." Well, that would only be if they sell. If they sell then they won't have pickleball. Or if they die but then they won't have pickleball.
- "if it is too noisy at the pool, for an additional \$25,000 we can put a water fountain in." DUH, isn't that admitting pickleball is NOISY!

So just some other observations...

- The grassy area between the tennis courts and the pool is an oasis for many dog owners who don't swim, use the gym or the tennis courts. Moving this area to the Desert Pavilion will be right next to someone's home and a much smaller area.
- The noise from pickleball will disturb people (mainly snowbirds) who spend ALL DAY at the pool in the winter, sleeping and reading. Sunbathers who rent in the winter won't like the noise either.
- I would hate to live near the noise. These poor homeowners can't sit on their patio and enjoy a cup of coffee in the morning.

As long term rental residents here in the community, we find it extremely disappointing and a mystery as to why Terravita would hesitate to include pickleball as one of their primary amenities.

As observers and proponents of the sport, we can think of numerous advantages to approving the creation or re-configuration of hard surface areas. The number one reason is it's simply a darn good game!! It's no longer an up and coming sport ... it's already arrived and continues to be a sought-after amenity for residential developments across the country. Primarily it's an easy sport to learn, play and appeals to all ages. It's a fun way to be social and allows for people to interact with family and meet new friends.

It's so popular that there's even a magazine devoted to the sport, professional pickleball tournaments are not televised and restaurants have constructed pickleball courts for their patrons.

We haven't even expounded on the health benefits of pickleball but it keeps the mind and body fit and improves the function of various organs of the body while maintaining a healthy lifestyle. It provides a cardio workout for many and can be a LIFETIME sport keeping the body active which in turn contributes to weight loss or weight management in our obese society. While the game is enjoyable, a Japanese study found that it also lowers levels of depression due to the positive aspects of socializing while keeping one's mind stress-free. And, the fact that it's healthy exercise as well as being fun makes a person want to include it in their routine work schedule.

COMMENT Dear Review Board Members: As a 15 year resident who purchased in Terravita because of the Olympic size pool, swim lanes, and beautiful tranquil area surrounding the pool, I see that being taken from me. Gone will be my socializing, reading, swimming, napping in the sun around the pool. I enjoy pickleball. But building a court in the proposed location will destroy the ambiance of the pool. The pickleball committee has not proven to any of us how they can guarantee sound mitigation. My sympathies are with the home owners in the immediate area for daily living and for resale opportunities. I whole heartedly agree with March Antonio's comments and ask your Board to: 1) Direct Terravita to have an 'independent' second sound study completed for the proposed location. Comment: 2) An agreed upon written plan for what technical noise mitigated will be required and what equipment is mandated for play. 3)An agreed upon written plan for days and hours of play, rules for players waiting to play and how rules will be enforced. 4) An agreed upon post-construction sound study to be conducted on actual noise during play, with both pickleball courts and both bocce ball courts in use at the same

time. This study will then be compared to the original projections for any necessary corrective actions. I attended the Zoom meeting on July 26th and received no answers to any of the above by the Board of Directors. Terravita residents were never surveyed about wanting a pickleball court - let alone by the pool backing up to homes Again, I urge you to insist the Pickleball proponents answer our concerns.
