ACTION

Accept the Audit Committee recommendation for the Airport Advisory Commission Sunset Review. Accept the Audit Committee's recommendation and authorize continuation of the Airport Advisory Commission.

BACKGROUND

At its February 27, 2026 meeting, the Audit Committee voted (3-0) to recommend continuation of the Airport Advisory Commission.

In September 2011, the Council adopted Resolution No. 8823 establishing a Sunset Review process for its boards and commissions. This resolution directed the Audit Committee to develop a schedule for reviewing the City's boards and commissions to evaluate whether:

- a) The reviewed board or commission is serving its intended purpose;
- b) The purpose should be maintained or modified; and
- c) The purpose has been served or is no longer required.

Subsequently, the Audit Committee is to recommend to the Council whether to continue or terminate the reviewed board or commission.

The Audit Committee confirmed its adopted process and adopted the current Sunset Review schedule in May 2024, with the goal of reviewing each applicable board or commission once every three years. The adopted process requires the City Auditor to notify each board or commission and staff liaison of its scheduled review. The City Auditor also collects background information on the board or commission, including its purpose as stated in City Code, its annual reports and other information as requested by the Audit Committee, Council or otherwise deemed relevant. Public comment may also be provided to the Audit Committee at the scheduled meeting, in written format, or through other means.

For the current review schedule, the Audit Committee has completed 12 Sunset Reviews, which are listed on page 2.

ANALYSIS & ASSESSMENT

Policy Implications

The Airport Advisory Commission's purpose, as provided in Scottsdale Revised Code Sec. § 5-109(c) provides that this Commission's purpose is, with the assistance of city staff, to advise the City Council as necessary on:

- The Airport capital improvement program and financial plan.
- Rules, regulations, and minimum operating standards under this chapter.
- Environmental policies affecting Airport operations and projects.
- Aviation-related development proposals or land use policies at and surrounding the Airport or other development proposals in conflict with 14 C.F.R. Part 150, as amended, or other aviation-related laws, ordinances, rules, regulations or planning documents. In addition to advising the City Council, the Airport Advisory Commission may take action to inform the Planning Commission of such conflicts.
- Fees imposed by the city in connection with the Airport and the Airpark.
- Lease policies regarding city-owned property at the Airport.
- Land use policies at and surrounding the Airport in conflict with 14 C.F.R. Part 150, as amended, or other aviation-related laws, ordinances, rules, regulations or planning documents. In addition to advising the City Council, the Airport Advisory Commission may take action to inform the Planning Commission of such conflicts.
- The future role of the Airport as part of the statewide air transportation system.
- Safety matters under the jurisdiction of the Airport.
- Such other matters as the City Council may direct.

Also, SRC Sec 5-109.1 added the Airport Appeals Board, stating that it was created to hear requests for variances and perform such other duties as are imposed on the board by SRC Chapter 5. SRC Sec 5-101 defined the Airport Appeals Board as consisting of the Airport Advisory Commission Chairman, another Airport Advisory Commission member appointed by the Chairman, and a city representative appointed by the City Manager or his designee.

SRC Sec 5-125 specifies the City Council has the right and prerogative to initiate its own review of any Airport Appeals Board decision, but only upon the affirmative vote of four council

members taken within 20 days following the Board's decision. Further, Council reviews are to be scheduled between 15 and 40 days following their initiation.

Community Involvement

Continuation of this Commission allows its members to continue working with city staff to advise the Council on aviation-related matters. Further, this Commission provides the opportunity for additional public participation from Scottsdale citizens and others through its regularly scheduled public meetings.

RESOURCE IMPACTS

Staffing, Workload Impact

If continuation is approved, existing City staff will continue supporting this Commission in meeting its purpose. This support includes serving as staff liaison to schedule and coordinate commission meetings, presenting staff recommendations, maintaining commission records and other such duties. Currently, Aviation Director Rick Wielebski and Airport Administrative Coordinator Andrea Kelley provide the Commission's staff support.

A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SCOTTSDALE, ARIZONA, DIRECTING THE AUDIT COMMITTEE TO DEVELOP A SCHEDULE FOR THE PERIODIC REVIEW OF BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS AND AUTHORIZING THE AUDIT COMMITTEE TO REVIEW BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS PURSUANT TO THE ESTABLISHED SCHEDULE AND MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE COUNCIL REGARDING THE CONTINUATION OR TERMINATION OF THE BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS REVIEWED.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Ordinance Nos. 2236, 2304, 2480 and Division 6 of Chapter 2, Article III of the Scottsdale Revised Code, Section 2-118, the City Council established the Audit Committee to consult with the City Auditor regarding technical issues, to work to assure maximum coordination between the work of the City Auditor and the needs of the City Manager and other charter officers and to perform other duties as required or directed by the City Council; and

WHEREAS, the City Council desires to establish a schedule for the periodic review of the City's boards and commissions to determine whether the boards and commissions are meeting their intended purpose and whether to continue or terminate such boards and commissions;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Scottsdale, as follows:

Section 1. The City Council hereby authorizes and directs the Audit Committee to perform the following duties pertaining to the City's boards and commissions:

- a) Develop a schedule for reviewing the City's boards and commissions;
- b) Review the City's boards and commissions in accordance with the established schedule;
- c) Evaluate whether each board and commission reviewed is serving its intended purpose; whether the purpose of each board and commission should be maintained or modified; and whether the purpose of each board and commission has been served or is no longer required; and
- d) Submit to the City Council its recommendations regarding whether to continue or terminate each board and commission reviewed.

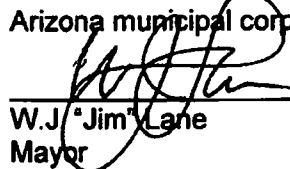
Section 2. Notwithstanding Section 1 of this Resolution, the City Council may terminate a board or commission at any time.

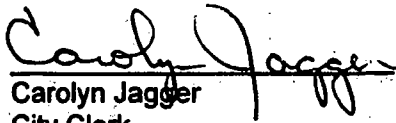

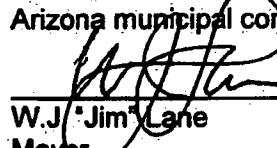
