







# Item 16

Building a 3-story (42 foot tall) parking garage directly across from the Old Adobe Mission and Cavalier's Blacksmith shop will permanently scar Historic Old Town. The Old Adobe Mission and Cavalier's blacksmith-shop began before Arizona's statehood in 1912 and Scottsdale becoming a place in 1921 and later a town in 1951.

## PETITION

Councilmen Graham and his colleagues insist that in 2019 when voters approved Question Two which contained 32 items including Item 32 = \$21 million for "Parking Structures in Old Town Scottsdale", and that they actually voted for a garage across from the Old Adobe Mission and Cavalier's Blacksmith-shop. However, that location was never disclosed to the voters for their approval. In a recent survey, 375 Scottsdale voters were asked: Do you support spending \$20 million of your property taxes to build a marginally needed garage across from the Old Adobe Mission? 87% responded NO!





