ACTION

Adopt Resolution No. 13506 authorizing the filing of a declaratory judgment lawsuit by the City against the State of Arizona to challenge the legality and constitutionality of Senate Bill 1543.

BACKGROUND

For several years, Axon has worked to gain approval to build a new global headquarters and housing development in north Scottsdale. To realize its plans for a mixed-use campus that included nearly 2,000 apartments and a hotel, Axon required a rezoning approval from the Scottsdale City Council. Opponents of this development criticized the density of the project and pointed out that Axon bought the land when it was zoned for light industrial use.

In November 2024, the Scottsdale City Council approved the rezoning. In response, a citizen group called Taxpayers Against Awful Apartment Zoning Exemptions ("TAAAZE") gathered sufficient signatures to force a public referendum on the development. This paused the Axon project until a public vote can be scheduled for the referendum, to be no later than November 2026. Following this, Axon's CEO publicly stated that Axon may move to another state if the global headquarters project was not approved. It was reported that Axon was also engaged in an extensive lobbying campaign at the state capitol wherein its lobbyists worked with state lawmakers to introduce a "strike-everything" amendment to an unrelated bill, Senate Bill 1543 ("SB 1543"), in March 2025. The amendment specifically addressed the issue and appears to have been crafted to allow Axon to bypass the Scottsdale referendum vote. SB 1543 was passed by the Arizona Legislature and was signed into law by Governor Katie Hobbs on April 18, 2025. SB 1543 becomes effective September 26, 2025.

If the City Council wants to mount a legal challenge to SB 1543, the City Attorney recommends that the City Council approve the filing and prosecution of a legal challenge in a declaratory judgment lawsuit to be brought by the City against the State of Arizona. The proposed lawsuit is rooted in the principles outlined in the Scottsdale General Plan 2035 and reflects the City's commitment to: 1) Foster community collaboration by defending the integrity of the public referendum process and ensuring land use decisions remain transparent and inclusive of resident input; and 2) Ensure development sensitively responds to neighborhoods, infrastructure, and character by preserving the City's ability to evaluate and regulate projects—such as the proposed Axon development—in a manner consistent with Scottsdale's long-term

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vision and infrastructure capacity. SB 1543 threatens to override local zoning decisions that reflect Scottsdale's carefully cultivated character, undermines local planning authority, and circumvents the democratic process established by Scottsdale voters. The proposed lawsuit seeks to uphold the values of responsible growth, civic engagement, and neighborhood compatibility as outlined in the General Plan.

ANALYSIS & ASSESSMENT

Recent Staff Action

The City Attorney's Office has retained the services of attorney Dominic E. Draye of the law firm Greenberg Traurig to represent the City's interests in this matter. The City Attorney's Office has been working closely in collaboration with Mr. Draye in order to effectively manage the proposed litigation and conserve costs to the extent possible.

Policy Implications

If SB 1543 is not successfully challenged, it will become law and may limit the City's ability to exercise local control as more fully discussed herein.

RESOLUTION NO. 13506

A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SCOTTSDALE, MARICOPA COUNTY, ARIZONA, AUTHORIZING THE FILING OF A COMPLAINT FOR DECLARATORY JUDGMENT BY THE CITY AGAINST THE STATE OF ARIZONA TO CHALLENGE THE LEGALITY AND CONSTITUTIONALITY OF SENATE BILL 1543.

WHEREAS, for several years, Axon has worked to gain approval to build a new global headquarters and housing development in north Scottsdale. To realize its plans for a mixed-use campus that included nearly 2,000 apartments and a hotel, Axon required a rezoning approval from the Scottsdale City Council.

WHEREAS, in November 2024, the Scottsdale City Council approved the rezoning.

WHEREAS, in response, a citizen group gathered sufficient signatures to force a public referendum on the issue, with a public vote scheduled for November 2026.

WHERAS, after reported lobbying efforts by Axon, a "strike-everything" amendment to an unrelated bill, Senate Bill 1543 ("SB 1543"), was introduced which specifically addressed the issue and appears to have been crafted to allow Axon to bypass the Scottsdale referendum vote.

WHEREAS, the Arizona Legislature passed SB 1543 and Governor Katie Hobbs signed it into law on April 18, 2025.

WHEREAS, SB 1543 will become effective on September 26, 2025.

WHEREAS, in order to challenge the legality and constitutionality of SB 1543, a declaratory judgment lawsuit would need to be brought by the City against the State of Arizona.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Scottsdale, Maricopa County, Arizona, as follows:

Section 1. The Interim City Attorney and his respective staff and designees are authorized to file and prosecute a Complaint for declaratory judgment against the State of Arizona challenging the legality and constitutionality of SB 1543.
