2023 SECURITY PROCEDURES

The WM Phoenix Open presented by Taylor Morrison and the PGA TOUR are committed to providing the safest experience for both players and fans. Fans should be respectful to the players and courteous to fellow patrons. Those displaying egregious behavior will be removed from the tournament immediately.

Tournament officials are working hard in advance of the upcoming tournament to ensure the enhanced security procedures are implemented seamlessly and that the public is aware of them prior to arriving at the main tournament entrance. Much of the TOUR's security policy will be implemented behind the scenes and will have virtually no impact on your experience as a spectator. So, as you begin to plan for the upcoming WMPO please take the following procedures into account. We've highlighted the key elements of the security policy below.

BAG INSPECTION

- Bag inspection will be performed at all Admission Gates while gates are open.
- Opaque bags, including purses, are not to exceed 6"x 6" in their natural state. Guests will not be allowed to empty and collapse a non-approved bag into a clear bag.
- Clear plastic, vinyl, or other carry items not exceeding 12"x 6"x 12".
- Volunteers bringing additional items to their assigned shifts must use a clear bag that does not exceed 12"x 6"x12". All volunteers will pass through a security checkpoint prior to entering the golf course.

METAL DETECTION

- Everyone attending the tournament is subject to search at the entrances and on the course at any time.
- Walk-through metal detectors will be used at each entrance gate for everyone including volunteers, spectators, working staff, media, etc.

PROHIBITED ITEMS LIST:

- Prohibited items will <u>not</u> be permitted on any shuttles •
- **NO** bags larger than a small purse 6"x 6" including
- carrying cases, backpacks, camera bags, or chair bags
 NO clear plastic, vinyl, or other carry items larger than
 12"x 6"x12"
- **NO** glass cups or bottles of any kind except for medical or infant needs
- **NO** memorabilia including pin fl ags, photos, trading cards, balls and other sports paraphernalia
- **NO** computers or laptops
- **NO** fireworks or laser pointers
- **NO** lounge or over-sized chairs with extended foot rests
- **NO** seat cushions in a carrying case or that have pockets or compartments
- NO pets, except for service animals
- NO knives, firearms or weapons of any nature
- **NO** video cameras (All Week)

- NO point and shoot, film or DSLR cameras (During Competition Rounds)
- **NO** selfie sticks or hand-held camera stabilizers
- **NO** beverages (patrons may not bring in or exit with beverages) or coolers
- **NO** radios, TVs, or portable speakers
- **NO** posters, signs or banners
- NO motorcycles, mopeds, tricycles, bicycles (whether or not motor-driven), skateboards, hoverboards, or other similar devices will be permitted to be operated on or within tournament property. Segways[®], motorized scooters or other personal transportation devices are prohibited if not used as a mobility aid by individuals with mobility impairment
- **NO** drones, Remote Controlled Model Aircrafts or other devices that can be operated in airspace will be permitted to be operated at PGA TOUR events during tournament week.

UPDATED PGA TOUR AUTOGRAPH POLICY

- Autographs can only be obtained at designated Autograph Zones.
- On-course autographs are not permitted. This includes, but is not limited to, tees, fairways, greens and practice areas during practice rounds and tournament rounds.
- No memorabilia can be brought into the tournament including pin flags, photos, trading cards, balls and other sports paraphernalia.

PERMITTED ITEMS

- Personal bags 6"x 6" or smaller
- Clear plastic, vinyl or other carry items not exceeding 12" x 6" x 12"
- A one-gallon clear resealable plastic bag
- Reusable plastic or metal cups/bottles that are empty upon entry and exit, and cannot hold more than 32-ounces
- Mobile phones, tablets, and PDA's MUST be on Silent mode and adhere to TOUR's Mobile Device Policy
- Point and shoot, film or DSLR cameras with lens smaller than 6"; no case (During Practice Rounds Only)
- Umbrellas without sleeve

- Portable radios with headsets
- Medically necessary materials, strollers, small diaper bags, plastic baby bottles, and other essential baby supplies (infant must be with carrier) - items subject to search
- Collapsible chairs without chair bags
- Binoculars without case
- Seat cushions that do not require a carrying case or that do not have pockets or compartments

2023 Security Plan for the Birds Nest at the Waste Management Phoenix Open

Scottsdale Police Officers and PRO EM staff will provide security from Wednesday, February 8, 2023 through Sunday, February 12, 2023.

Approximately 85 Scottsdale Police/Officers from local, state law enforcement agencies, and 135 PRO EM staff are assigned each day of the event. Bag and ID checks will be conducted by PRO EM at the gate, as it is a 21 and older crowd. Minors will not be admitted.

Roaming teams of police and PRO EM will constantly monitor the crowd for disorderly people. Problems will be dealt with in a professional manner, resulting in ejection and arrest if necessary.

PRO EM staff will be assigned at the exits to prevent alcohol from leaving the premises.

The coverage afforded by this provision:

- (a) Is effective on the acquisition date, and is afforded only until the 180th day after you acquire or form the organization or the end of the policy period, whichever is earlier;
- (b) Does not apply to "bodily injury" or "property damage" resulting from an "accident" that occurred before you acquired or formed the organization; and
- (c) Does not include any newly acquired or formed organization that is:
 - (i) A joint venture or partnership; or
 - (ii) An "insured" under any other automobile liability policy or would be an "insured" under such policy but for the termination of such policy or the exhaustion of such policy's limits of insurance.
- e. - (2) You can definitively establish that the terms and conditions of the written "insured contract" ultimately executed are the same as those which had been agreed upon prior to the "accident" or "loss".
- f. Any of your "employees" while using a covered "auto" in your business or your personal affairs, provided you do not own, hire or borrow that "auto".

B. Coverage Extensions - Supplementary Payments

Paragraphs A.2.a.(2) and A.2.a.(4) of Section II – Covered Autos Liability Coverage are replaced by the following:

- (2) Up to \$3,000 for cost of bail bonds (including bonds for related traffic law violations) required because of an "accident" we cover. We do not have to furnish these bonds.

L. Blanket Waiver Of Subrogation

- a. However, we waive any right of recovery we may have against a person, organization or government entity when you have waived such right of recovery under a written "insured contract" that is:
 - (1) Currently in effect or becoming effective during the term of this policy; and

§9-834. Prohibited acts by municipalities and employees; enforcement; notice

- A. A municipality shall not base a licensing decision in whole or in part on a licensing requirement or condition that is not specifically authorized by statute, rule, ordinance or code. A general grant of authority does not constitute a basis for imposing a licensing requirement or condition unless the authority specifically authorizes the requirement or condition.
- B. Unless specifically authorized, a municipality shall avoid duplication of other laws that do not enhance regulatory clarity and shall avoid dual permitting to the maximum extent practicable.
- C. This section does not prohibit municipal flexibility to issue licenses or adopt ordinances or codes.
- D. A municipality shall not request or initiate discussions with a person about waiving that person's rights.
- E. This section may be enforced in a private civil action and relief may be awarded against a municipality. The court may award reasonable attorney fees, damages, and all fees associated with the license application to a party that prevails in an action against a municipality for a violation of this section.
- F. A municipal employee may not intentionally or knowingly violate this section. A violation of this section is cause for disciplinary action or dismissal pursuant to the municipality's adopted personnel policy.
- G. This section does not abrogate the immunity provided by section 12-820.01 or 12-820.02.
